FOREWORD

The design in publishing this history and genealogy is to preserve such facts as have been collected. They cannot fail to add to the information, and add to the interest of the descendants of Robert Flint, the pioneer.

I am aware that the work is incomplete but hope that I have given such information as may enable those who care to, to trace back their lineage to their ancestors. Doubtless many facts relative to our ancestors were never recorded, and all memory is lost forever.

It would not be strange if there should be some inaccuracies in a work of this kind. I have stated nothing but what I believe to be derived from good authority. When in doubt I have suggested the reasons for my conclusions. Some one in later years may be able to unearth other records which will make this history more complete. The Bibles of some of the old families have produced a good deal of the following material, while the United States Census records, wills, deeds, church, county and town records have made the record more complete.

I have divided the outline into a number of chapters. The first five chapters are about the common ancestor Robert Flint, the pioneer; his immediate family and his possible ancestors. Robert Flint, the pioneer had five sons, namely Robert Flint, Alexander Flint, Cornelius Flint, John and Adam Flint. The next five chapters deal with each of the descend-

ants of the aforesaid sons in the order named.

The eleventh chapter gives a list of Flints who are buried in cemeteries in the State of New York. This record is not complete, but it will help those who are interested to locate the graves of their ancestors.

The twelfth chapter covers the pension papers of Robert Flint, Jr. who served in the American Revolutionary War and the pension papers of Martin Flint who served in the War of 1812.

The last chapter pertains to the original land holdings of Robert Flint the pioneer, and his descendants. A map is presented to help the descendants to locate the original farms held by Flints in the vicinity of Sprout Brook, N. Y., before the Revolutionary War.

I have adopted a common use of numbering the descendants. But I have started each one of the five sons of Robert Flint, the pioneer as a separate line. I thought and hope that each one of the many descendants will find this a very helpful way of discovering their ancestors. You will find that at the end of some of the chapters I had to use a more complicated system of numbering. The reason for this was because this material was given to me after this book was practically ready for publication. I did not want to leave out this additional valuable information so I hope that the readers of the publication will be able to follow the complicated system of numbering.—C. E. F.

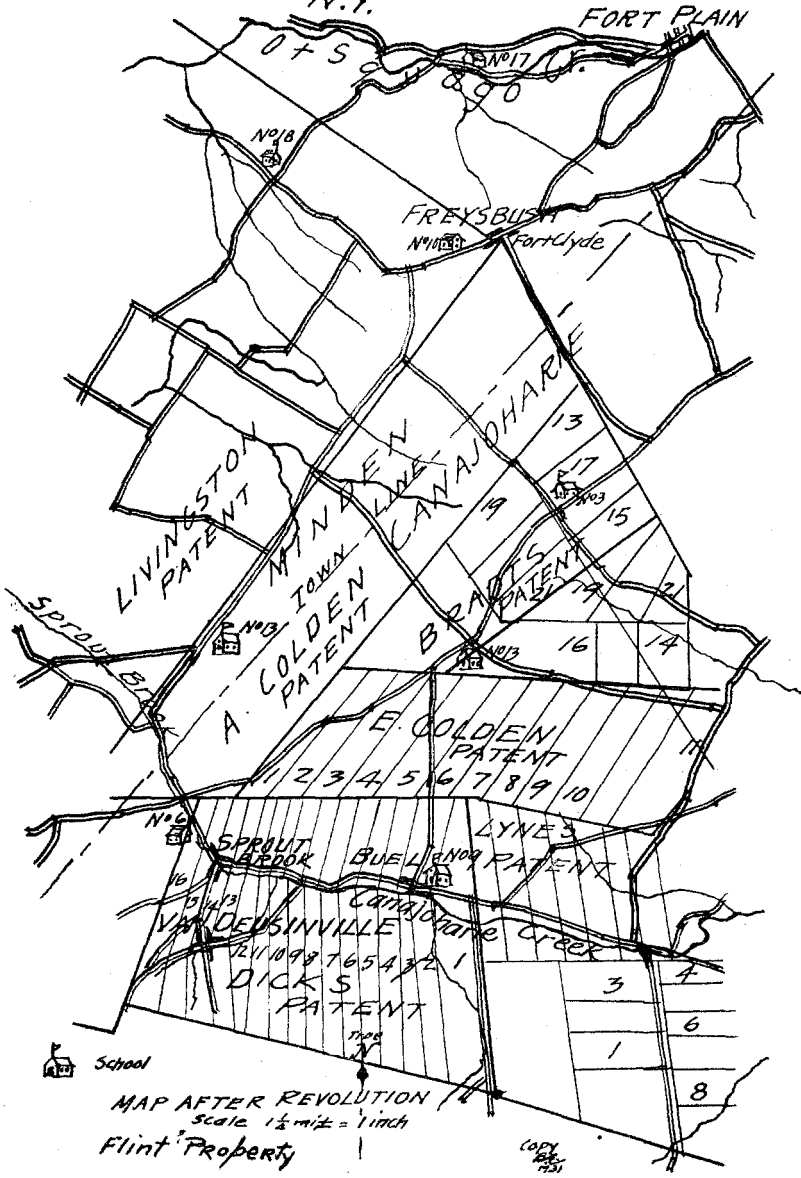

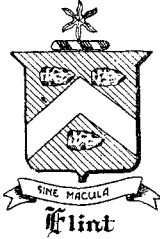
His line of descent from the pioneer Robert is as follows: Robert, the pioneer who had a son John Flint, who married Susanna Bowman. They had a son Martin Flint, born 1780 at Canajoharie, N. Y., died Jan. 7, 1856 at Gainesville, N. Y. who married on Sept. 15, 1805 Leah Hickey the daughter of George Hickey. Martin Flint's fourth son was called Michael Hickey Flint (1829-1913). He married Rutilla M. Wilcox. Michael and Rutilla's oldest son was called Elon Arthur Flint, born July 24, 1849 at Gainesville, N. Y. and died March 24, 1883 at Campbellsport, Wis. Elon Arthur Flint married on July 24, 1871 at Campbellsport, Wis., Susan Adelaide Cisco. Their only son was called Clarence Elon Flint. He was born June 18, 1872 at Cascade, Wis. Clarence Elon Flint married on Feb. 21, 1900 Winifred Ellis, the daughter of Griffith Ellis and Ann Williams. Their oldest son was called Clarence Ellis Flint, the author of the Flint series. The line is therefore, Robert, John, Martin, Michael, Elon, Clarence and C. Ellis Flint.

History and Genealogy of the Flint Family Who Trace to the Pioneer Robert Who Settled at Sprout Brook in the Days of Sir William Johnson.

Descendants of Robert Flint, the Pioneer Who Settled at Sprout Brook, Montgomery Co., N. Y.

Robert Flint, the pioneer settled in the vicinity of Sprout Brook, Montgomery county, N. Y. some time between the years 1735 and 1750. The following material has been compiled from many sources such as family notes, family Bibles, town, county, church, state records and friends of the Flint family.

I would have been pleased to have made this work still more complete, but I have been unable to do so up to the present time. I am hoping that those descendants who may have material and fuller details at their command will forward this information to me or to Mr. MacWethy, so that a fuller genealogy can be printed. I am aware that I have not a complete

list of all names, dates, etc. of each family. Many of these dates and names were never recorded and all memory of them is lost forever, but any information which can be forwarded will help in the solution of this work.

Robert Flint, the pioneer, had five sons, namely Robert, Adam, Alexander, John and Cornelius and one daughter Elizabeth, according to the records which we now have; and also from tradition, if I may be allowed to base genealogy on tradition until I have presented the records and my own conclusions.

I find that Robert Flint, the pioneer, lived in Albany, New York before 1735, as two of his sons Adam and Alexander were baptised in the Reformed Church of Albany. In Munsell's History of Albany, Vol. 4,

page 122, Robert Flint is mentioned with his wife Joanna (Susanna) and that they had a lot on Gallows hill. The children are Adam, baptised Nov. 23, 1735 and Alexander baptised Nov. 6, 1737. Robert Flint is found later about 1750 around Sprout Brook. In the Sir William Johnson Papers, there is a note where Robert Flint is ordered by Sir William to take care of and feed some Indians about that time.

Mr. Ralph N. Flint of Detroit, Mich. furnishes the record of the marriage of Robert Flint to a Zusan-na Bauman on Jan. 1, 1732. He was married at the Reformed Church at Schoharie, N. Y. He was also admitted as a member on confession of faith at this same church, Dec. 25, 1731. Robert Flint, the pioneer made a deed Feb. 21, 1773, recorded Dec. 5, 1799 which is given in these notes. When this deed was recorded both the witnesses that signed the deed were dead, but Robert Flint, Jr. (2nd generation) swore that he was present when the deed was made, and that he saw the grantor sign it. It would be very interesting to know when and from whom this land was purchased. Some one of the numerous readers of these notes may be able to help us. Robert Flint, Jr. (2nd generation) also left a will of importance recorded in 1802. I also find wills of two other sons of Robert, the pioneer, namely, the wills of Adam and Cornelius Flint. These three wills are recorded at Fonda, N. Y. and will be given later on in these notes. I have found no wills for either John Flint or Alexander Flint up to the present time. But, there is considerable information to be found in mortgages, deeds, census reports, Revolutionary War Records and the deed of Robert Flint, the pioneer.

Robert Flint, Jr., was appointed

the administrator of John Flint's estate in 1795, but I have never found anything stating the amount of his estate, except from deeds and conveyances made in later generations of the Flint family. I find here and there a mention of "John Flint's land, deceased" etc., so I imagine that the will was never probated, if there was one made.

CHAPTER II.

Revolutionary Flints

Alexander, Adam, John and Cornelius Flint are all mentioned as soldiers in the First Regiment Tryon County Militia commanded by Col. Samuel Campbell in the Revolutionary War. See the book New York in the Revolution. Robert Flint, Jr. (3rd generation) is also mentioned as serving in the same company. This Robert Flint, Jr. being the youngest to serve, lived to receive a pension, and I find a considerable amount of information about him in records easily obtainable. Revolutionary pensions were not granted until 1832 and the other four men having died before that time, we have no detailed account of their service.

The descendants of the five sons of Robert Flint, the pioneer, are quite numerous and are scattered over the entire United States. I will always speak of the first known Robert Flint as the pioneer, so as to keep him separate from the numerous following Robert Flints.

Various Strains of Flint Family

It might be fitting to first mention something about the different strains of the Flint family in this country before Robert Flint, the pioneer. I haven't been successful in tracing the ancestors of Robert, the pioneer, but I am going to give the little informa-

tion which I have obtained, in case, at some future date, some one will be able to use this material. There may be mistakes or omissions in this work, but any additions or corrections will be gladly accepted.

I am going to suggest six possible earlier strains of Robert Flint, the pioneer. Some one may be able to trace back these leads. The following Flint strains or families settled in this country before 1735. The first known being a Capt. Thomas Flint of Virginia and his descendants. I find the first record of this Capt. Thomas Flint in the year 1618. See Neill's "Virginia Carolorum Page 73." Capt. Thomas Flint is mentioned as bringing emigrants to the English settlement at Elizabeth City, Virginia. He received 50 acres of land in Virginia for each emigrant landed in the settlement. There is a record that he owned the ship "Temperance." This Capt. Thomas Flint became quite a figure in Virginia. The following material is a brief outline of what I've been able to find about him and his descendants.

2. Neills' "Virginia Carolorum" p. 73 Thomas Flint in the "Diana" 1618, County Justice Warwick River the present Warwick Co. 1632. Page 90 Thomas Flint member House of Burgess, Warwick Co., March 1, 1642 to March 1, 1643. Page 167 Thomas Flint member House Burgess, Warwick Co., March 1, 1643. Page 199 Thomas Flint, member House of Burgess, Warwick Co., Nov. 3, 1647.

3. Croziers Virginia Records Vol. 6 page 23 Thomas Flint, Lieut. of the "Temperance" 1621 and page 156 received a 100 acres for transporting William Chelmedge and John Bradford. Page 66 Thomas and Mary Flint living in Elizabeth City, Thomas held a grant for 50 acres in 1626 and Mary Flint held a grant of 100 acres in 1625. Page 71 Richard Flint and John Ingram held a grant of 406 acres in Northumberland Co., in 1651. Page 115 Richard Flynt had 150 acres in Northumberland county in 1657. Page 143 John Flynt, a tailor, living in Northumberland county (Eastern) shore left a will dated Aug. 15, 1704, proved March 29, 1706. No issue. Leaves all to various friends.

4. William and Mary Quarterly. Vol. 5 page 138. Richard Flint, Jr. was elected a member of the House of Burgess for Northumberland Co., in 1692, but his seat was successfully contested by Capt. William Jones.

Vol. 6 page 105 Archibald Flint was living in Lancaster County in 1717.

Vol. 9 page 886, Capt. Thomas Flint in 1627 was living on 50 acres of land leased from William Stockton of Barkewell, County of Warwick, England.

Vol. 12 page 179 Thomas Flint and Gilla Roult were married in Lancaster Co, Aug. 19, 1766.

Vol. 15, page 52 Thomas Flint was in the assembly of 1631-32 as Burgess from Mulberry Island, Elizabeth City, County.

Vol. 18, page 177, Ann Flint and William Geedridge of Lancaster County were married Nov. 19, 1795.

Vol. 21, page 110-111 David and Richard Flint were on the Pittiables in St. Mary's White Chapel, Lancaster, Co., 1716.

Vol. 23, page 200, Richard Flynt, Jr. Burgess for Northumberland County, Dec. 21, 1793.

Vol. 4, Series 2, page 117, David Flint resided at Dumfries Prince William County from 1758 to 1761.

5. Virginia Magazine, History and Biography.

Vol. 1 page 445 Lt. Thomas Flint had 1000 acres on the south side of Warwick River adjoining Poole's land granted to him Feb. 9, 1627 for transporting 20 persons on the ship "Temperance." He came to Virginia on the "Diana" in 1618 was Burgess from Warwick River Hundred Warwick County 1629-1630; for Keith's Creek 1631; for Shirley Hundred 1632; for Danbeigh, 1632-33; for Warwick (2nd time), 1642-43 for Warwick (3rd), 1647. Tax Com. for Warwick River 1631, wife's name Mary.

Vol. 2, page 76 and Vol. 7, page 262 Mary Flint, the ancient planter, now the wife of Thomas Flint of Warwick River, as her first dividend has 100 acres in the corporation of Elizabeth City commonly called "Foxhill" abutting westerly on the Creek, passing through same from the land of Point Comfort Island granted by John Pott, March 4, 1628.

Vol. 2, page 78 Lt. Thomas Flint of Elizabeth City had a lease of 50 acres called the "Indian Houwse Thicket" being a neck of land formerly held by Capt. Jabez Whitacre granted Sir George Yeardsley (Gov. of Va.) Feb. 23, 1626.

Vol. 11, page 316-17, Thomas Flint was the witness of will of Rev. Thomas Butler who also mentions "friends Capt. Thomas Flint and Mary, his wife, Nov. 20, 1636.

Vol. 12, page 449 Thomas Flint's son Henry Flint was living in Rappahannock County in 1683 and sold land to William Bruce, (See Rappahannock Records, Vol. covering 1686-88, Va. State Library).

Vol. 14, page 263, Feb. 23, 1627 Sir Georeg Yeardley issued a Commission appointing Thomas Flint a Lt.

Commander of and for the inhabitants and plantations upon both sides of Southampton River at Elizabeth City towards head of the same and about Charles Fort.

Vol. 23, page 233. In June, 1644 the General ordered 300 men to be raised in the county of James City, York, Warwick, Elizabeth City, and Northampton to proceed against the Indians who had massacred 400 of the inhabitants of Va. and Capt. Thomas Flynt was designated from Warwick Co., from which was to be selected a Capt. and Lt.

Vol. 25, page 192 Richard Flynt was living at Wicoinoco, Northumberland County, Nov. 20, 1658. Page 417 Thomas Flint, the son of Richard was a defendant in an action brought against him by John Harris of Wicoinoco Parish, Nov. 14, 1680.

Vol. 28, page 150 John Flynt and 19 others were transported into Northumberland County (Eastern Shore) Sept. 12, 1660 by John Michaell who received from the Governor and council 1000 acres. They all came in the ship which Capt. John Michaell commanded, (name of ship not given). This man was the John Flint, Tailor of Northampton who died without issue, the will dated Aug. 15, 1704.

Vol. 29, page 300, Names of 20 persons brought by Lt. Thomas Flint in the "Temperance."

Vol. 30, page 261-64. Capt. Thomas Flint in his younger days had seen service with the Welsh Troops in the Netherlands. On Nov. 1628 he was charged with improper conduct towards his wife's daughter (by her 1st husband), Dorothy Beneathland. (See Vol. 32, page 354) and he was fined 1000 lbs. of tobacco and deprived of his title of Lieut. until the fine was paid. He must have had some temper for he cursed the Governor

roundly, which added to the enormity of the case, as the Governor ordered him "to be layed by ye heeles." Page 269 Peter Strafferton and Thomas Flint had a suit of law, Nov. 22, 1628. Page 270 at a court held Jan. 20, 1628 Thomas Flint and Mary his wife came into the court and surrendered all thos estate, right title and interest in the 1000 acres situated in Stanley Hundred Warwick County that they had acquired from John Brewer.

Vol. 31, page 147 John Army stands indebted to Thomas Flint for 900 lbs. of tobacco, March 4, 1628. Page 189 Richard Flynt was high sheriff of Northumberland Co., Feb. 1682 as he testifies in suit of William Presley vs. John Mottrom. Page 192 a Mrs. A. O. Keach of Wichita, Kansas in writing up her genealogy of the Presleys of Northumberland states that in the year 1895-96 she visited a William E. Flint, then sheriff of Northumberland County whom she found to be one of the best informed residents of the county.

The Virginia line seems to be as follows from the above information:

1. Capt. Thomas Flint married the widow Mary Benethland and had Henry and Richard Flint. Richard had Richard Flint, Jr. who had 1. David Flint, 2. Richard Flint, 3. Archibald Flint.

Thomas may have been the grandfather of Robert Flint.

This strain is the first possibility. But there is no clue of any Robert in this entire line as far as I was able to find.

CHAPTER III.

The next four leads are: A Thomas Flint and a William Flint of Salem, Mass. and a Henry Flint of Braintree, Mass. and a Thomas Flint of Concord, Mass. There is a little information about this William Flint,

Henry Flint and the Thomas Flint of Concord, Mass., in the introduction of the book called "A Genealogical Register of the Descendants of Thomas Flint of Salem, Mass., compiled by John Flint and a John H. Stone." Andover Edition, 1860.

Thomas and William Flint of Salem were brothers and most likely arrived in this country before 1640. William Flint is mentioned in the Salem records in 1642. This William Flint has two sons, Edward and Thomas Flint. Their descendants are unknown to me. These two sons are the second possibility.

Henry Flint came from England in 1635 and he was a clergyman. Henry had five sons, only one of whom grew to manhood and married. Josiah Flint was his name. Josiah Flint had three sons, one Henry Flint died unmarried; the other two I was unable to trace. These two sons are the third possibility.

Thomas Flint of Concord was a brother of Henry Flint the Clergyman. This Thomas Flint settled in Concord, Mass. in 1638. He had two sons John and Ephraim Flint. I know nothing of their descendants. These two sons are the fourth possibility.

The other known Thomas Flint was the one who settled in Salem, Mass. The following deductions have been taken from the record of this Thomas Flint as compiled by John Flint and John H. Stone. This Thomas Flint had four sons, first Thomas Flint, second George Flint, born Jan. 6, 1652, third John Flint born Oct. 3, 1655 and fourth Joseph Flint. This George Flint born Jan. 6, 1652 married on May 22, 1666 a Hannah Moulton and they had a son by the name of George Flint, born April, 1672. I know nothing of his descendants. John Flint born Oct. 3, 1655,

the son of the aforesaid Thomas Flint of ~~Concord~~, married and had a son Samuel Flint born Oct. 12, 1679. I know nothing of his descendants. Either one of these two men, namely Samuel Flint born Oct. 12, 1679 and George Flint, born Apr. 1672 could have been the father of Robert Flint. These two men are the fifth possibility.

The last or the sixth strain is a Benoni Flint who was granted land in Southampton, N. Y. He married there in June 10, 1675 a Mary Browne daughter of William Browne. Robert Flint could have been the son of this man. These are the only clues in this country that I have been able to locate which give us good suggestions to his ancestors.

On looking for clues in England before 1620 I find a few leads as to his ancestry. There is a series of Wills in Vol. 56 of the New England Hist. Gen. Register, pages 312, 317 about the Flints of Matlock, Derbyshire, England. The name Robert occurs quite frequently in several of them.

The following is an outline of these wills:

Will of Robert Flint of Matlocke in ye countie of Darbye, sezke in body. Dated will Apryll mccccxlix, 111 Edward. Proved 25 Oct. 1549. Mentions wife, Elizabeth, daughters Alys and Catherine, sons Wille, Robart, Antony, Wylliam and James.

Will of Jame Fflinte Sept. 1590, mentions wife, Johanne Bowneals flinte, children, Thomas, Henry, Anthony, William, Robert, Colette and Agnes minor children of said deceased.

Will of George Fflint, 1620 mentions wife Johannes and minor children, Margaret, Robart, Thomas, George and Anthony.

Will of Edmunde Fflinte Dated 27, mch. 1628, Proved 9 April, 1632, mentions brother Roberte Fflinte, wife and children.

Will of William Flint, merchant "in the good ship London" weake in body. Dated 20, August, 1632, names brother Thomas executor, Uncle Robert Flint, clothworker in Matlock, in Derby and his children.

Will of Thomas of Matlock, co., Derby, husbandman, dated fifth or first of July, 1642. Proved 5, Oct., 1642 mentions wife, Agnes, son Geo., daughter Agnes Turner, son in law Daniel Walker, grandchild Thomas (son George's eldest son), grandchild Adam Fflinte, 2nd son of said George. Also a number of other grandchildren.

From these wills there is a possibility that Robert Flint, the pioneer is a descendant of one of the above families. This is about all that I have been able to find about the strains before Robert Flint, the pioneer, that are of concrete form and fact.

If he is a descendant through one of these emigrant strains mentioned, I would say that he is either a grandson or a great grandson of one of them. I think that if the line is ever established through one of the six strains, it will be found that Robert the pioneer, was a great grandson of one of the original emigrants, with the possible exception of descent thru Banoni Flint.

ROBERT FLINT THE PIONEER

CHAPTER IV.

Robert Flint's, the pioneer, children were born or baptized about 1735 so I would say that the approximate birth day of Robert, the pioneer was between 1700 and 1710.

The deed which was made in 1773 by Robert Flint, the pioneer to his son Cornelius Flint is presented here.

Robert Flint Deed

Copy of Deed of Robert Flint, the pioneer, to his youngest son, Cornelius Flint as copied from the records:

THIS INDENTURE made and concluded this twenty first day of February in the thirteen year of the reign of our sovereign Lord George the third by the grace of God over Great Britain, France and Ireland King defender of the faith &c and in the year of our Lord God one thousand and seven hundred and seventy three; between Robert Flint of Conojoharry in the County of Tryon and Province of New York yoman of the one part and Cornelius Flint of Conojoharry aforesaid yeoman of the other part,

Witness that the said Robert Flint for and in consideration of the love good will and affection which he bears to his well beloved son the aforesd Cornelius Flint, doth hereby freely, fully and absolutely bequeath grant to, set over, convey and confirm unto the sd Cornelius Flint a cartin pice of land and to his heirs and executors or administrators and assigns forever, the same now being

in his actual possession two tracts or parcels of land sutiated lying and being in Conojoharry aforesd on the south side of the Mohawk River and is a part of the patent known by the name of Dick's patten and is butted, bounded and described as follows: beginning at the north where the sd acres besides the above mentioned lot out of numbr twelf then runs along the north end to number eleven and ten to the east corner of number ten then down the line southarly of number nine and ten until it comes to the corner where the fence now stands then with a west line to the number twelf then along number eleven and twelf until the place where the above twenty acres is to mesered to sd Cornelius Flint is to leave a road with geates and other necessarys for John Flint and Alexander is to help repairing sd road with geates and other necessaryes and likewise the said Cornelius Flint is to pay the sum of four pounds New York curincy to his sister Elizabeth Boman or to her heirs or assigns after the diseise of sd Elizabeth is father when demanded, and likewise the sd Cornelius is to pay the annual current due to his Majisty the sd Cornelius Flint and his eirs executors, administrators and assigns to have and to hold all the above granted given and bequeathed primmises with all singular and proffits appertainces priveledges and comdoties to the same belonging whether buildings

timber woods and underwoods water and water courses springs mines and minerales or querrys or and other priveledge or right or property of what kind soever to him the said Cornelius Flint his heirs and executors, administrators and assigns to his and their own proper use benefit and improvement and behoof forever, and the said Robert Flint for himself and heirs doth hereby covenant to and with the said Cornelius Flint his heirs and assigns that until the ensealing and delivery herof he is the true, sole and lawful owner of the above said parcells of land and hath in himself alone full power and lawful authority to give, grant and dispose of the same in manner and form as above mentioned free and clear from all manner on incumbrance whatsoever, further more the said Robert Flint doth hereby bind himself, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever, to warrant, secure and defend the said Cornelius Flint his heirs and assigns in the peaceable and quite possession of the above granted premises against the lawfull claims or demands or any person or persons whatsoever.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the said Robert Flint hath hearunto set his hand and seal the day and date above written.

Elizabeth Married Boman

From this deed we find that he had a daughter Elizabeth Flint who

married a Boman. I know nothing of her descendants as I have no intentions of trying to follow the numerous girls of the Flint family past the first or second generation. There are three men mentioned in the will Cornelius Flint, Alexander Flint and John Flint. Cornelius Flint is given the farm and is mentioned as a son so we have one son established. Alexander and John are also mentioned as follows: "Cornelius Flint is to leave a road with geates and other necessarys for John Flint and Alexander Flint which said John and Alexander is to help repair said road with geates and other necessarys." So, I would say that Alexander and John received a farm apiece most likely earlier in life or when they were married. I don't think that a man would leave or state such a request unless they were his sons. From this conclusion I believe that John Flint is a son of Robert Flint, the pioneer. From the baptismal record there is no doubt about Alexander being a son of Robert, the pioneer.

CHAPTER V.

Records of Second Generation

I have received the birth or baptismal records of the sons, John, Robert and Cornelius. But I have never been successful in locating the original source of this information. I give them here in case at some future time they may be of value in this work.

The following dates are as they were given to me:

Adam Flint, born Oct. 10, 1732.

Alexander Flint, born Nov. 6, 1737.

John Flint, born Oct. 10, 1739.

2nd Lt. Robert Flint, born March 12, 1742.

Cornelius Flint, born Aug. 14, 1745.

Only one of the above dates seem to check with other information, which I have, and that is the date Nov. 6, 1737 of Alexander Flint. Earlier in these notes I gave the record taken from Munsell's History of Albany, Vol. 4, page 122 of Adam Flint and Alexander Flint. In this case I find that the birth date and baptismal date are identical of Alexander Flint. This is possible but not probable. The birthday of Adam Flint is logical and probable because of our other record from Munsells in regard to the baptismal date of Adam Flint. The next in line is John Flint. In addition to the above date, I find the record of a John Flint, born May 17, 1726 and died Jan. 12, 1795. This is taken from the records of Rev. Wock in the Utica Public Library, Utica, New York. The death date checks with the other information we know about John Flint, when we use the date of Jan. 23, 1795 when the Letters of Administration were issued to Robert Flint, Jr. for John Flint's estate. Were there two John Flints living in the same vicinity who died about the same time or is the birth date incorrectly recorded? This birth date comes before the marriage of Robert Flint, the pioneer. Either John Flint of the birth date in 1726 is the son of Robert Flint, the pioneer or a cousin or no relation whatsoever. It is possible that the date was copied wrongly from the original records or recorded incorrectly in the first place and should have been 1736. From the deed of Robert Flint, the pioneer, I would deduct that John Flint is a son until these dates are firmly established. The following work is based on this conclusion.

The next in line is Robert Flint of the 1802 will or the one who served as a 2nd Lt. in the Colonial forces in

Capt. Gilbert Van Alstyne's Company of the 2nd Albany Regiment, Sept. 10, 1762 to Aug. 8, 1763. This is taken from the New York State Historian Report Colonial Series Vol. II, page 786 and 797. From the contents of this 1802 will Robert Flint, Jr. seems to have been the wealthiest of the five sons. This will is listed a little later in these notes.

The last and youngest known son of Robert Flint, the pioneer is Cornelius Flint. I find that in the records of the Stone Arabia Reformed Church of the town of Palatine, Montgomery county, New York, that a Cornelius Flint was baptised Oct. 14, 1741 as a son of a Robert and Susanna Flint. Is this date correct or is the birth date given heretofore correct. I am going to accept this date of 1741 until I find the source of the date 1745 given earlier in these notes. There is of course a possibility that this first Cornelius Flint died and a later child born in 1745 was given the same name. This is all I have on the birth dates of the five sons; except that I might add that some one may have access to the original records of Rev. Wock, which are in the possession of the New York Gen. and Biog. Society. Will they kindly check this birth date of John Flint.

From the Federal Census of New York of 1790, page 101, Montgomery County, New York, I find the following men in the town of Canajoharie (including Sprout Brook) namely:

I also find a mortgage by Robert Flint (2nd generation) of Oct. 9, 1797 which is most likely a purchase money mortgage involving 150 acres. Robert Flint, the 2nd lieutenant, had a son who served in the American Revolutionary War, who was spoken of earlier in this record. His record is taken from the Bureau of Pensions at Washington, D. C.. (See chapter on Pensions.)

Adam Flint saw service before the Revolution as he served in the same company as 2nd Lieutenant Robert Flint. Adam served in the Colonial Militia in Capt. Gilbert Van Alstyne's Company, April 26, 1760, aged 20, height 5 ft. 3 in., complexion fair, brown eyes, hair brown. This is taken from the New York State Historian Report, Colonial Series, Vol. 11, page 586.

I find on consulting the book called the New York Wills in the New York Historical Society Collections, 1894 on pages 267 and 268 a Josiah Hand's will. Josiah Hand was the son of Shamgar Hand of Southampton, N. Y. Josiah Hand's will was dated Feb. 4, 1738-9 and proved March 30, 1739, leaves property to his son David and a daughter Johanna Flint. Who is this Johanna Flint, is she of any relation to our Robert Flint, the pioneer; 2nd Lt. Robert Flint or John Flint, of the birth date May 17, 1726? I mention this here so that some one at a future date, may be able to establish this Johanna Flint.

There seems to be two Johanna Flints according to our present re-

ords. The first mentioned in chapter 1 of this series is found in Munsell's History of Albany, Vol. 4 page 122. Robert Flint is mentioned with his wife Johanna (Susanna)? Then in the next paragraph in the same chapter, I give the marriage record of Robert Flint to a Zusanna Bauman on Jan. 1, 1732. Did this Zusanna Bauman die early, and then did Robert Flint marry Johanna Hand? Or was this Johanna Hand related to some other strain of the Flint family? If our Robert Flint, the pioneer, married this Johanna Hand, some one may be able to connect the pioneer to the Flint families of Connecticut or Long Island. See the town records of Southampton, Easthampton, Southhold, Sag Harbor and other Long Island town records; also Howell's History of Southampton, Hedge's History of Easthampton, and Documentary History of New York.

In a book called "Documents Relative to the Colonial History of the State of New York," procured in Holland, England and France by John Romeyn Brodhead, Agent; edited by E. B. O'Callaghan, M. D. Vol. 7, page 171. Printed in Albany in 1856. The following is relative to the French & Indian War. "Journal of Sir William Johnson's Proceedings with the Indians, (New York Papers L. I., No. 85").

"Fort Johnson"

23 July, 1756.

The following is part of the report on the above mentioned page, "23, July, Several Delawares from the Western Branch of the Susquehanna arrived at Fort Johnson and acquainted Sr. William that there were about 100 men of their people by the way and would be here in two days,

and that he might provide provisions for them, both at his house and on the road. He dispatched two of them with an order to John Wells of Cherry Valley and to Robert Flint to supply them by the way and to tell them he was ready to receive them and would be glad to see them at his house. They returned many thanks and promised to be ready at any time to join our arms."

There may be more material about these men in the records of the state of New York payrolls etc. from the Revolutionary War. There is only one that I was able to find and that is a Certificate of pay issued to John Flint for services as private in Capt. Renier Van Everat's Company of Lt. Col. Samuel Clyde's Regiment of

Tryon County militia (Canajoharie). The original record was burned. This is taken from the Roster of State Troops printed in the State Archives V. 1. Documents relating to Colonial History of the State of New York Vol. 15, page 372. New York State Library, Albany, New York.

It may be of some interest to mention according to tradition that these five men were called the "Five Fighting Flints." From what I know of the Flint family it seems as tho this must be true as the different strains still show a little temper now and then. This has nothing to do with genealogy and yet again it may have helped the numerous Flint families to help conquer this continent.

ASSISTANCE APPRECIATED

I want to thank the following people for the valuable information which they have given me. This work would not have been as complete as it is, if they had not been as generous in their help in supplying me with many of the descendants of Robert Flint, the pioneer. These people live in all part of these United States. Mr. Ralph N. Flint of Detroit, Mich. supplied practically all of the material of the Alexander Flint line. George B. Flint of East Springfield, N. Y. and Esther Flint Coppernoll of Johnstown, N. Y. also gave valuable material on this same line.

William J. Flint and his daughter Marjorie Flint of Mt. Vernon, Iowa, and Mrs. P. B. Smith of Red Oak, Iowa supplied a good deal of the descendants of the Adam Flint line. Mr. Peter Flint, former president of the Flint Association which meets in the vicinity of Cherry Valley each year kindly supplied many descendants of the Cornelius Flint line. Isaac C. Flint, the present president of the Flint association and Gillette Flint of Cherry Valley also helped me with the descendants of Cornelius Flint.

I am indebted to Major Weston Flint of Boston, Mass. for a considerable amount of information about the descendants of 2nd Lt. Robert Flint. Vernon Doyle, of Rochester, N. Y. was able to supply a considerable amount of material for the John Flint line. I am also indebted to the following people for additional information about the Flint family. They are Miss Louie Flint of Gainesville, N. Y.; Dr. Wm. J. Flint of Watertown, N. Y.; Elizabeth F. Weller of Cherry Valley N. Y.; Jacob McFee of Ames, N. Y.; Rena Flint Brockmeyer of Schenectady, N. Y.; Bessie Flint Van Alstine of Cherry Valley, N. Y.; Harvey Flint of East Springfield, N. Y.; Mrs. Mary Dussel, of Scotia, N. Y.; Charles E. Poole of Brookings, S. Dakota; Mrs. Eva P. Jones of Foster, Wis.; Miss Sara Cleveland of Osage, Ia. and Mrs. Mary Flint Davis. There are many others, their names innumerable. I express a sincere gratitude to all for help in this common cause of recording for all time a record of our ancestors.

The following is the record of the family of the son 2nd Lieutenant Robert Flint. His will is given here-with:

Will of Robert^s Flint

Surrogate's Court, Montgomery County. Last Will and Testament of Robert Flint, recorded the 10th day of Nov., 1802 in Montgomery County Surrogate's Office in Book of Wills No. 1 at page 242.

In the name of God Amen. I, Robert Flint, of the Town of Canajoharie and County of Montgomery in the State of New York, being weak in body but of sound memory blessed be God, do this nineteenth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and two make and publish this last will and Testament in manner following, that is to say, first and principally I commend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me and my Body to the Earth from whence it came in hopes of a full pardon of all my sins and a joyful resurrection through the merits and intercession of my blessed Redeemer Jesus Christ and as for that worldly estate where-with it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give devise and bequeath the same manner and form following:

Item First I give to my beloved wife, Deborah Flint all my personal estate except what I shall will to my children hereafter and likewise my Farm that I now live on as long as she continues my widdow, she maintaining and educating my children in the best manner she can out of the farm I now live on.

Item I give to my son William Flint one year old celt which is now

in his possession to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give to my three sons William Flint, Joshua Flint and George Flint two hundred acres of land which lies in Harpers Patent to be divided between them equal share and share alike to them their heirs and assigns forever if they should sell the s. d. land the money must be divided between them equal share and share alike and if there is any quit rent due on s. d. two lots of land the same shall be paid out of the farm I now live on.

Item I give to my three sons Samuel Flint, David Flint and James Flint forty five acres of land in Delaney's Patent and the farm I now live on after my wife decease or when she is no longer my widdow to them their heirs and assigns forever equal share & share alike. I will that the forty five acres of land in Delaney's Patent be divided with the farm I now live on so that the farm that I live on may have what wood it wants so long as there is any wood on it.

I give to my son Robert Flint (this is the Robert Flint Jr. of the Rev. War.) One hundred acres of land to be purchased by my three sons Samuel Flint, David Flint and James Flint out of the forty five acres of land in Delaney Patent and the farm that I now live on if that cannot be done I will that that the said Samuel Flint, David Flint and James Flint pay unto my son Robert Flint one hundred and fifty pounds in money when my youngest son James Flint comes to be age or when the youngest son that revives comes to age to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Flint one milch cow, one hypher, one feather bed, one bedstead and bedding sufficient for the bed, one spinning wheel, one iron pot, six plates, six knives & forks, and one Puter dish or platter to her heirs, & assigns forever. The remainder of my personal estate at my wifes decease or when she is no longer my widdow shall be divided between all

of my children equal share and share alike to them their heirs and assigns forever.

I make, constitute and ordain my beloved wife Deborah Flint executrix, John Bowman, and Charles Powell executors to this my last will and testaments they paying my just debts and funeral expenses six months after my decease and my bequeaths as soon as the law directs.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this nineteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two.

1. Robert Flint, the son of the pioneer served as a 2nd Lieutenant in the Colonial forces as mentioned heretofore. He lived in the vicinity of Sprout Brook, N. Y. See his will of 1802. From present records I would say that he married twice; the name of the first wife unknown at this time. By this first marriage he had one known son who was called Robert Flint, Jr. in many legal documents. I follow along this line, so as to keep him separate from the other Robert Flints. I imagine he was called and signed his name Robert Flint, Jr. for the same reason.

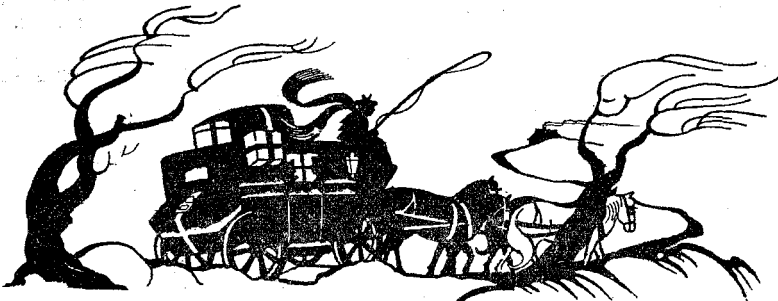

I find William Flint, No. 3, born 1775, died October 20, 1828 with no known descendants. But since outlining this line I have received the following information.

William Flint had a brother James Flint No. 8 and a sister Elizabeth Flint, No. 9 of this same line. I have always understood that James Flint, No. 8 was drowned in Genessee Falls, N. Y. James Flint's brother Samuel Flint No. 4 had a grandson called Eugene Flint. He was living in 1927 near Pike, New York. He told me when I visited him that Jas. Flint was drowned as mentioned heretofore. A descendant of Elizabeth Flint No. 9 Mr. Eugene Chapel, 253 Broadway, New York city claims that James Flint No. 8 married a Cynthia Tobey. But a granddaughter of Cynthia Tobey claims her grandfather was William Flint No. 3. I do not know who is correct, but from my past experience and the statement of Eugene Flint, I accept William Flint No. 3 as the husband of Cynthia Tobey. Also the grand children should be able to give their grandparents or uncles. In this case two grandchildren's statements check. I abide by this reasoning unless other record prove to the contrary. The following are the descendants of William Flint No. 3 who married Cynthia Tobey, youngest daughter of Nathaniel and Deborah Finney Tobey of Lee, Massachusetts, (see Lee town records). The granddaughter who claims Cynthia married William Flint No. 3 is Emerett Fauver Robson.

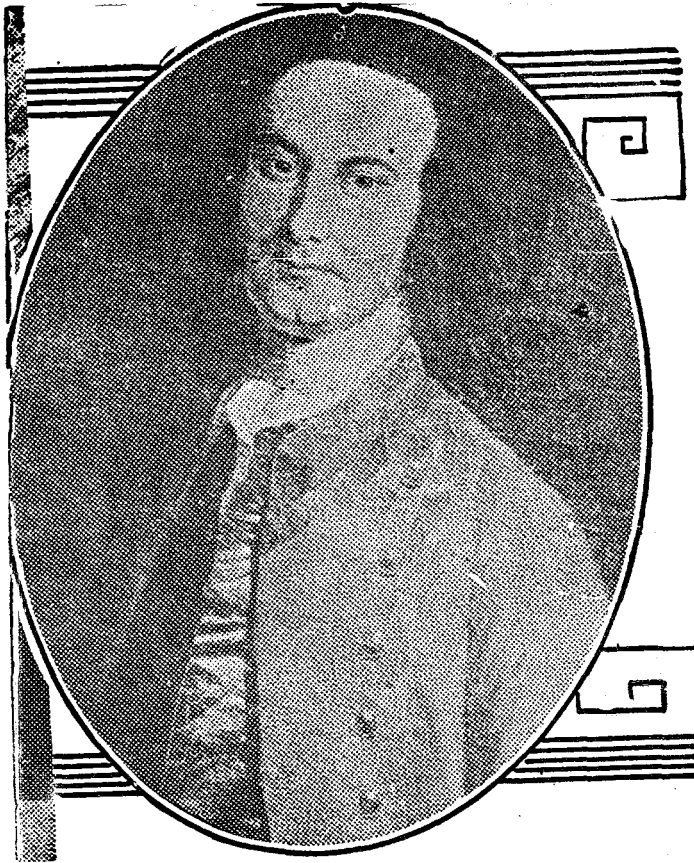

Sir William Johnson came into the Mohawk Valley in 1738 as Indian Agent for the British Government. His influence grew until at the close of his career he was the outstanding figure in Indian affairs for the North American continent. It is due to his policy of pacification and wisdom in treating with the Indians that settlement of the valley by the whites was possible. He was a friend of Robert Flint the Pioneer. He was born in Ireland in 1715 and died at Johnson Hall in Johnstown, July 11, 1774. He died possessed of vast territories of land all of which was dissipated and confiscated by his heirs who took the Royalist side during the Revolution and preyed directly on their former neighbors in the Mohawk Valley.

The second initial being the letter of the father's name. Alexander Flint followed this custom. This is the way I identify John A. Flint and Robert Alexander Flint or Robert A. Flint as he was sometimes called. The other children are identified in other records. There is no other place for these men in any of the other families, and this family checks with the census of 1790, I have placed these two men and their descendants with this Alexander Flint line. Some one may have an old record or chart that will definitely establish these two men as sons of Alexander Flint. He also had a tavern at one time. There are deeds and mortgages to be found which give us a little information about Alexander. He is also men-

tioned in the deed of Robert Flint, the pioneer to his son Cornelius Flint. Alexander's farm was adjacent to Cornelius Flint's farm. In the old deed, I find that Cornelius is to give John Flint and Alexander Flint access to the road. So, Robert Flint, the pioneer, must have established Alexander Flint earlier in life, say about 1760. He died in 1810. I found a stone on the old family plot on the Dunkell farm which no doubt marks his grave. The stone has the initials "A. F. 1810."

THE LINE OF CORNELIUS FLINT

CHAPTER VIII.

The Line of Cornelius Flint, the Youngest Son of Robert Flint, the Pioneer

Cornelius Flint inherited the old farm from his father Robert Flint, the pioneer as mentioned heretofore in these notes. We know more about Cornelius Flint's descendants than the other four brothers because this side of the family did not scatter over the entire country. In fact, a great number of his descendants still lives within a radius of 100 miles of the old farm. I was a good deal more successful in tracing this side of the family for this reason. Cornelius Flint left a will which helps us to establish his line quite easily. That will is recorded in the Surrogate's Court of Montgomery County and is given here. I was also able to find old notes and Bibles still in the possession of the descendants of Cornelius Flint's sons. The old Reform Church records also contain a good deal of valuable information about this family. And of course, the old cemeteries in the vicinity of Canajoharie, N. Y. gave us additional information. The other lines would have been more complete if I could only find out where the different strains migrated to.

Cornelius Flint's will is as follows:

Recorded the 17th day of January 1817 in Montgomery County Surro-

gate's Office in the Book of Wills No. 3 at Page 21.

In the Name of God Amen, I Cornelius Flint of Canajoharie in the County of Montgomery and State of New York being weak in body but of sound memory blessed be God do this Twenty Fourth day of February in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen make and publish this my last will and testament in the manner and form following that is to say:

FIRST and principally I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it to me and my body to the earth from whence it came in hopes of a full pardon of all my sins and a joyful resurrection thru the merits of my blessed Redeemer Jesus Christ. And as for that worldly property and estate, wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give, demise and bequeath the same in manner and form following,

FIRST I give demise and bequeath unto my son Peter Flint my old Homestead farm and all which belongs to the same, and the equal two fifths to be together parts of a lot No. five near the black creek in the town of Canjohary containing in the whole fifty acres of land at the west side thereof, so as to have a neat building spot on the road leading to Curry's town. Also all my household furniture after my decease, he living and to live with me to work my said Homestead farm and to maintain me and my wife (now his stepmother) decently as we now live, myself during my natural life, and my wife (if I should die first) during the time she shall continue to be widow and chooses to live with him. Also all my stock of any kind whatsoever together with my farming utensils which with the stock may remain on sd. Homestead farm or elsewhere at my decease to him his heirs and assigns forever.

SECOND I give to my son Isaac Flint the north part of Lot No. six whereon he now lives containing and to contain to him fifty two and a half

acres of land. Also the equal one fifth part of the aforesaid fifty acre lot of land near Black Creek to him and to his heirs and assigns forever.

THIRD I give to my son Robert Flint, the south part of the aforesaid lot No. six whereon he now lives containing and to contain to him fifty two and a half acres of land and also the equal one fifth part of the aforesaid fifty acre lot of land near Black Creek to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

FOURTH I give to my son Cornelius Flint Jun'r a lot of land No. five on which he now lives containing fifty acres (more or less). Also twenty acres of land off the north end of Lot No. twelve (In Reeves Patent) now also in his possession, also nine rods wide of land to begin on Bowmans Creek road on the east line of the farm of William Beck to run a Northerly course as the sd. line runs towards the River half the length of the said line. Also the equal one fifth part of the aforesaid fifty acre lot of land near Black Creek to him, his heirs and assigns forever. The said fifty acre lot of land to be divided in such manner that each party may have a building spot on the Curry's town road. Also and

FIFTHLY I give to my daughter Elizabeth Lee the sum of eight dollars to be paid equally by my four sons aforesaid. Also I give to my son Peter Flint aforesaid my old wench named Ireds to remain with him on the old Homestead farm, and be maintained thereon during life unless she should choose to be sold and leave it. Also the young wench named Saar until free, unless he should choose to sell her time.

LASTLY I constitute ordain and appoint John Bauman, Noah Dodge and my son Peter Flint Executors to this my last Will and testament who are to see my bequests punctually divided and settled my just debts paid and the whole business to be finished and determined within six months subsequent to my decease according to the true intent and meaning aforesaid.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF I, the said Cornelius Flint have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year first above written.

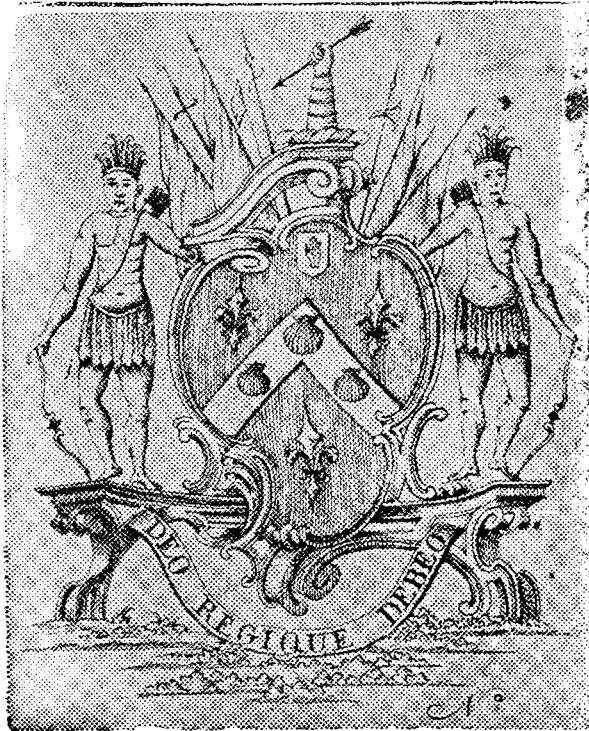

THE JOHNSON FAMILY ARMS

While the Johnson Family had Arms of their own, Sir William Johnson when he became a baronet and a man of power and influence adopted a coat of arms of his own designing. The shield is red with a chevron between three fleurs-de-lis, blue, three escallops of the field. Supported by two American Indians. Crest an arm holding an arrow.

The red hand of Ulster belonging to the O'Neils also appears on the shield. This is accounted for by the claim of Warren Johnson, a brother of Sir William who filed the O'Neil arms claiming descent from the famous O'Neils of Ireland.

THE LINE OF JOHN FLINT

CHAPTER IX.

John Flint, the Son of Robert Flint, the Pioneer

The following is the outline of the known descendants of John Flint, a son of Robert Flint, the pioneer. We know very little about the early life of John Flint and his wife Susanna Bowman. In fact, the only records found at the present date are those in deeds conveyed by later members of his and other families. He is mentioned in the census of 1790 and also as a private as mentioned heretofore in the 1st Tryon County Militia in the Revolutionary War. From my experience in this work of following the different lines I would say that there may be considerable more material to be discovered about the John Flint line. He may have had more children which may be identified in later years. His known descendants total about half the number of the other four sons, which leads me to believe that there may be any where from 50 to over 100 descendants unknown or lost for all time to come. The outline of his descendants is as follows:

1. John Flint married a Susanna Bowman and owned and lived on a farm near Sprout Brook, New York. He served in the 1st Regiment, 1st Tryon Co. Militia of New York. 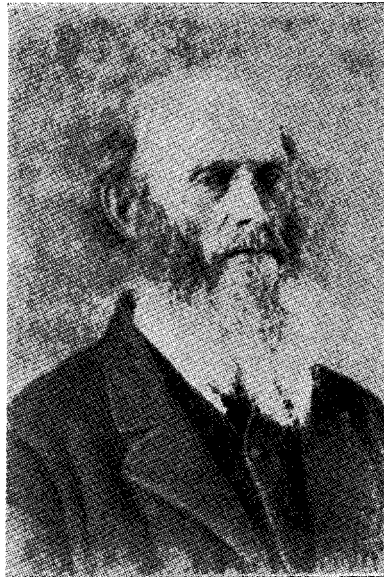

CHAPTER X.

THE FAMILY OF ADAM FLINT

Descendants of Adam, the Son of Robert, the Pioneer.

The following is the outline of the known descendants of Adam Flint Sr. a son of Robert Flint, the pioneer. Any corrections or additions will be gladly accepted. I present first the will of Adam Flint which was admitted to probate Feb. 12, 1829 Montgomery Co. Surrogate's Court W. Fenton Myers, Clerk of the Surrogate's Court.

Recorded the 12th day of Feb. 1829 Montgomery Co., Surrogate's office in book of Wills No. 4, page 235 and was examined by W. Fenton Myers, Clerk of the Surrogate's Court. The Will,--

I, ADAM FLINT, of Canajoharie in the County of Montgomery do make and publish and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following;--

First, I give and bequeath to my daughter, Susannah and Peggy my real and personal estate as long as they may live and after their death I give and bequeath my real and personal estate to my son Adam to him and his heirs forever. Also, I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth one dollar. I also give and bequeath to my daughter Hannah one dollar. I also give and bequeath to my son William one dollar, which legacies I will and order to be paid out of my estate. I also direct that my son Adam should stay on the farm and take care of Susannah and Peggy and provide for them and to manage the farm for them. I also will and bequeath my wearing apparel to my son Adam. I also appoint

Robert Bowman, Peter Walrath, Jr. and Thomas Sammons of Canajoharie, Montgomery County Executors of this my last will and testament.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal at Canajoharie this eighteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand and eight hundred twenty eight. Signed, sealed, published and declared by the above named Adam Flint to be his last will and testament in the presence of us who have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses in the presence of the testator.

The following names are descendants of the Adam Flint line. In a few cases I have branched two generations away from the name Flint. I think that this particular line is more complete than either of the other four and I want to thank those who have helped me in the solution of the Adam Flint line. A number of descendants in this line have been accepted in the Sons of the American Revolution and the Daughters of the American Revolution. I mention this here for those who may be interested. The line as I interpret it and all information available at the present date is presented herewith:

1. Adam Flint, bapt. Nov. 23, 1735, in the Reformed Church of Albany, N. Y., sponsors Martin and Maria Flensburgh. I have a record given me that he was born Oct. 10, 1732. He served in the French and Indian War in Capt. Christopher Yates Com-

pany. He enlisted April 26, 1755 at the age of 20 years according to his service record. I've mentioned earlier in these notes that I've never been able to find the exact source of the birth records of the five sons of Robert Flint. Quite a number of people have the record but where they obtained or located these dates, I have never been successful in finding the original source. If some one reading these notes happens to recall the source of the birth dates given heretofore, he or she will do a service for the Flint Family. Adam Flint also served in Van Alstyne's Company as mentioned earlier in this record. He was 5 feet 3 inches tall. Complexion was fair, eyes were brown and hair was brown. He also served in the American Revolution as Ensign in Col. Clyde's Regiment, Capt. Bowman's Company. He married Mary Elizabeth Horning, the daughter of Dedrick Horning of Canajoharie, N. Y. Adam was supposed to have served in the Battle of Oriskany, 1st Tryon Co. Reg. 1st Battalion, 1st Company.

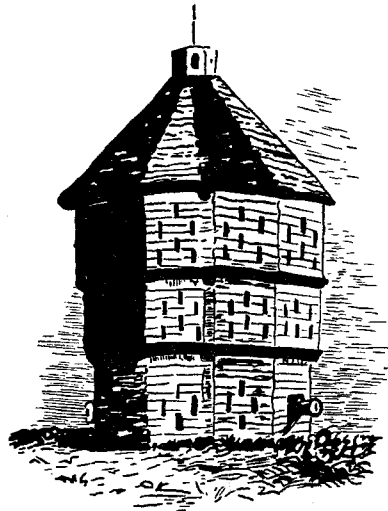

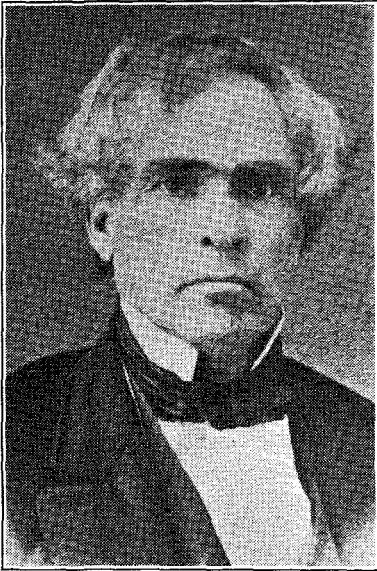

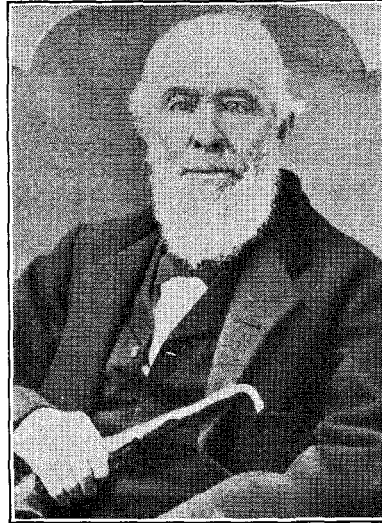


FORT PLAIN BLOCK-HOUSE.¹

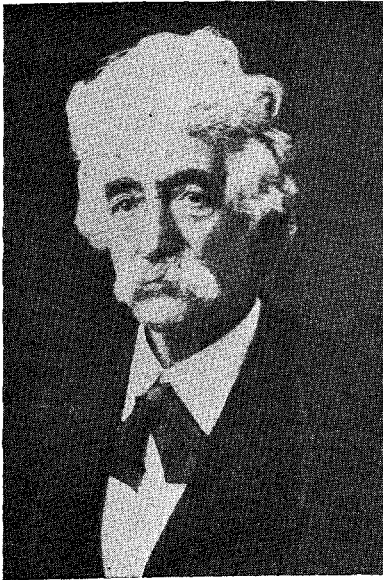


JOHN ROBERT FLINT, NO. 14

Beneath the crude limestone markers lies the remains of the early generations of the Flint families including Robert, the pioneer. Very few pioneer graves are marked. Robert Flint, a resident of the Town of Pike in the County of Allegany in the State of New York aged seventy-five years on the tenth day of March last, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress issued June 7th, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States, under the Officers hereinafter to the best of his recollection named and served as herein stated. That in the Month of April in the year of our Lord 1776 he reside at Bowdman's Creek in the then County of Tryon now Montgomery County in the State of New York, and was drafted with a part of the

Company to which he belonged, to go on service against the Indians, to Harpers fields. He does not recollect the name of the Captain under whose command he was placed but Col. Harper commanded the Regiment and he was employed in that service about three or four weeks. He left home the 4th of April, but does not recollect the exact time he returned. That in July 1777 he was again called into the service of the United States with others of the company of Militia to which he belonged, which was drafted and divided into classes and went in turn as they were called upon. He went at this time under the Command of Captain Peter Bowman, whose company was attached to Colonel Cox's Regiment, and marched to Unadilla for the purpose of protecting the inhabitants against the Indians. That General Herkimer and Col. Cox thus met with Brandt, the Indian Chief and a treaty of peace was there agreed upon between them, which was however violated on the part of the Indians the next month. That he was absent on this service about three or four weeks. That in the summer of the same year he was employed about a week with others of the company to which he belonged in going to Wood Creek for the purpose of obtaining the navigation of the creek; That this was militia service and performed under the direction of the Officers of the Company. In the month of October in the same year he was ordered out with others of

the company to which he belonged to join Col. Campbell's Regiment at Saratoga for the purpose of opposing the British forces under General Burgoyne, but before they reached the place of their destination they were informed of the surrender of Burgoyne and were ordered to return home. He was absent from home on this service about five or six days.

That in the month of May or very early in June, 1778 he was drafted as one of a company of Rangers, drafted from the Militia of Tryon county. That Adam Helmer was a Lieutenant and Captain Bakebread was the Captain of the Company which was attached to a Regiment commanded by Col. Peter Bellingier. That he joined the company at Cherry Valley and marched to German Flatts which was the station occupied by the Company, and where their rations were drawn through the seasons. That he was employed with Scouting parties against the Indians—that in such service he went several times to Unadilla and once on business connected with the service to Fort Stanwix where colonels Van Schaick and Gansevoort were then stationed. That he together with the other members of the said Company was dismissed from the service on the first day of January 1779 when he returned home. That in the month of April 1779 he was called out with a part of the Company of Militia to which he belonged and marched to Cherry Valley for the purpose of protecting the inhabitants against the Indians. That he was there when the meeting house and other buildings were burnt by the Indians. He was absent from home on this service about a week. Early in the summer of the same year he was drafted for service as one of the Garrison under the Officers of the Fort during two weeks. That in October of the same year he

was drafted for two weeks service which he performed at Fort Dayton under Col. Bellingier. That in the Autumn of the same year he was impressed with his wagon and horses to carry ammunition and baggage for Captain Woody of the Artillery from New England. That he was employed in the service about three weeks. That in November 1780, he went under the command of Captain Lipe, who was then under the command of Col. Willett to Johnstown where he was engaged in a battle against the British and Indians and he marched thence under the same officers to West Canada Creek where they had a successful skirmish with the British and the Indians. That he was absent on this service about two weeks. That at another time the exact date of which he does not recollect, he went with others of the Militia to Tioga Point on an expedition against the Indians. That Col. Winfeldt commanded the forces employed in that expedition, though he does not recollect the names of his Captain and Lieutenant. He was from home on this service about three weeks. That during the greatest part of the Revolutionary War he was required to be in readiness to march at a moment's warning whenever his services should be needed, and he always to the best of his ability obeyed the call. That much of his time at home, as well as that of most of his militia in the part of the county where he resided near the Mohawk River, was spent in military exercises, that he was frequently called upon when there was an alarm in the neighborhood and after marching three days, and sometimes a shorter period of service was required and he can not estimate with accuracy the amount of time he was in the service. That he has no documentary evidence and that he knows of

no person in this part of the county whose testimony he can procure, who can testify to his service except John G. Helmer of Pike. He was born at Canajoharie.

He continued to reside in the County of Montgomery until about the year 1821. Since which he has resided at Genesa County and in Allegany County in the State of New York. He believes that the time he was taken from his own business by service in the Militia and in the Company of the Rangers, in the service of the United States during the Revolutionary war would not mount to much less than two years, though as before stated, he can not estimate the time with accuracy. He was in several skirmishes with the Indians in the different periods of his service. He hereby relinquishes every claim what ever to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the Pension of the Agency of any State.

And the said applicant further states that he is acquainted with John G. Helmer and Samuel Flint and Alfred Hislip who reside in his neighborhood and who will testify as to his character for veracity and as to their belief of his services as a soldier of the Revolution. The said applicant has a record of his age and produces the same contained in his (family bible) a sheet containing the date of his birth with that of other members of his family.

Personally appeared before me the undersigned a Judge of the County Courts of the County of Allegany in the State of New York, Robert Flint who being duly sworn deposed and saith that by reason of Old age and the consequent loss of memory, he can not swear positively as to the precise length of his service but according to the best of his recollection he served not less than the periods mentioned below and in the following grades

That in the year 1776 he served as a private in the militia under Captain Bowman in Col. Harper's Regiment in the Spring four weeks that afterwards in the same year on sudden alarms from attacks by the Indians at different periods occupying from two to three days to one week, in the whole amounting to five weeks more that in the year 1777 he served at different periods under the officers of the Company of Militia to which he belonged, named in this Declaration, and at different places, sometimes for two or three days and some times three or four weeks as he believes amounting in the whole to at least two months.

That in the year 1778 he was in the service for one continued period of six months in a company of Rangers under Captain Bakebread and Col. Bellingers.

That in the year 1779 he served as a Sargeant in the Company of Militia to which he belonged at Cherry Valley, at Fort Plank and at Fort Dayton an din various marches to repel the Indians, he believes at least two months—he cannot say certainly that it was more though it appears to him that he was in the service more than half the time from April to November.

That in the year 1830 he served in another company of Militia as a private at different places and for longer or shorter periods at different places amounting in the whole to the time of three months as he believes.

That in one year of the war and he can not recollect which he was employed for the term of three

months in constructing a block house at Bowman's Creek and as one of the Garrison at that place. It was after the death of Capt. Bowman he does not recollect who commanded the company but Col. Clyde commanded the regiment and the Block House was built under his directions. At the time this Deponent made his Declaration he did not recollect this service. He recollects it was after the Oriskany Battle, because Captain Bowman was killed in that Battle, and for the above service this deponent claims a Pension.

Pension Papers of Martin Flint and Claim for His Widow Lea, Certificate No. 2542, War 1812

The following papers are from the Bureau of Pensions in claim for bounty land of Martin Flint, War of 1812 and claim for pension of his widow Lea Flint. Furnished by the Board of Pensions, Washington, D. C. by E. W. Morgan, acting Commissioner of Pensions.

a resident of the town of Gainesville in said county and state, who being duly sworn according to law declares that he is the identical Martin Flint who was a private in the company commanded by Captain Robert Bowman, in the regiment of the New York Militia commanded by George H. Nellis in the war with Great Britain declared by the U. S. on the 18th day of June, 1812. That he was called out together with the whole company of Militia on or about the 7th day of September 1814 from Canajoharie Montgomery county, in said state the place of his residence at that time. The term for which the company is called he is unable to state, but he continued in service in said war for the term of about two months and was honorably discharged at Sackets Harbor on the 8th day of November 1814 as will appear by his original certificate of discharge herewith presented and will appear by the muster rolls of said company.

He makes this declaration for the purpose of receiving bounty land to which he may be entitled in the Act granting bounty land to certain officers and soldiers who have been engaged in military services of the United States passed September 28th, 1850.

FLINT TITLE TRANSFERS

Genealogists frequently find that property descent is verified by the land deeds. The following four deeds, all filed in Montgomery Co., are given in support of the genealogical lines in the foregoing part of this work. For convenience they have been briefed but the proof of relationship will be readily identified.

Martin Flint to Jacob A. Flint—1805

The first deed was given in 1805 by Martin Flint to Jacob A. Flint. This indenture was made Sept. 10, 1805,

between Martin Flint of the Town of Canajoharie, County of Montgomery, State of New York, of the first part, and Jacob A. Flint of Canajoharie of the second part. The consideration is \$40.00, money of the United States and transferring a portion of land lying in Canajoharie aforesaid being the north part of the land set out to run from the estate of his honored father John Flint, late of said town deceased and begins five rods and nine links from the northeast corner of his north lot from thence west fourteen degrees north five rods nine links thence south fourteen degrees

west one hundred and nineteen rods twelve and a half links to a stake, thence east fourteen degrees south five rods nine links to a stake, thence north fourteen degrees east to the place of departure. Containing four acres.

It is signed by Martin Flint in the presence of Robert Bowman and Martin A. Flint.

The above deed was proved on June 20, 1808, before Jacob Eacker, one of the judges of the Court of Common Pleas who says, "Before me came Martin Flint who by the oath of Robert Flint proved to my satisfaction, etc., to be the same person described and who executed the within conveyance."

This proof of conveyance was signed by Jacob Eacker and recorded on Nov. 7, 1808, in Liber 11 of Deeds at page 289, Montgomery Co.,

Robert Flint and Margaret Flint, His Wife to Henry Bowman—1806

This indenture was made the Nineteenth day of March, 1806 and was between Margaret Flint and Robert Flint, both of the Town of Cherry Valley, Otsego county, New York, party of the first part and Henry Bowman of the town of Canajoharie, Montgomery county, State of New York, of the second part. This was for the sum of \$60.00 in which the parties of the first part did sell and release to Henry Bowman of the second part a certain part of lot of ground formerly owned by John Flint, deceased, situate, lying and being (in the County of Montgomery) within the patent formerly granted to Capt. William Dick and was known as lot No. 2 in the subdivision of Lot No. Twelve, said parcel of ground being four rods wide and beginning at the north end of

said lot No. Twelve and runs as far towards the south end of said lot No. Twelve as the Sprout Brook so called containing four acres; be the same more or less, being a part of the equal Eleventh part of said lot granted to us.

This deed was signed by Robert Flint and Margaret Flint by her mark and was witnessed by John Ellwood and Martin Flint. This was proved before Jacob Eacker mentioned in the former deed and recorded in Montgomery County, N. Y. on July 12, 1808.

John Flint to John A. Flint—1829

This deed was made on May 18, 1829 between John Flint of the town of Cherry Valley, County of Otsego, State of New York, of the first part, and John A. Flint of the town of Canajoharie, Montgomery County of the second part. This calls for a part of land lying within the Dick patent and is part of lot No. Twelve and in a subdivision made and consented to by the heirs of John Flint, deceased, called lot No. Eight, beginning at the southwest corner of Peter Flint's land at a certain cornerstone marked, and runs north to the land now owned by Henry Lieber across the Old Bowman Creek Road, where it formerly used to be, thence west to lot number seven in a subdivision, thence south with a parallel line along lot number seven across the Sprout Creek till it comes directly opposite with Peter Flint's southwest corner, containing eight acres more or less. Also all of lot number seven from the Sprout Creek running south till it comes directly opposite said Peter Flint's southwest corner, being in Canajoharie. The party of the second part is to come in possession of said land as soon as Jane

Snyder's death and not before. The consideration is \$140.00.

This deed is signed by John Flint and delivered in the presence of Elijah Flint, and William Young.

The deed was recorded on June 8, 1829, before A. J. Comrie, Clerk of Montgomery county, N. Y.

John Flint and Wife to Levi Beardsley—1840

This deed was made February 20, 1840 between John Flint and Eve, wife, party of the first part, and Levi Beardsley, Esq. of the second part. Sum is \$5,500 and transfers all that certain piece or farm of land in Canajoharie, Montgomery County, lately owned by Stephen Barnes, and conveyed by him and wife to the said John Flint, being a part of Dick's patent so called and supposed to be a north part of Lots No. ten and eleven, and being the same farm conveyed by Robert Flint to Cornelius Flint by deed dated 21st of February, 1773, except 20 acres part of lot number 12 mentioned in said deed which farm was devised to Peter Flint by Cornelius Flint and also including a small piece of land devised by Cornelius Flint to his son Cornelius Flint, Jr., which Peter Flint afterwards obtained by purchase. Excepting out of this conveyance about four acres of land heretofore conveyed to Henry R. B. Walradt, by Peter Flint, being a small lot on the west side of the farm on the road, the land hereby intended to be conveyed is bounded by lands of John Wiles on the east by lands of Rich-

ard R. Floming, on the south by lands formerly owned by William Snyder hereinafter next described, and on the the west by lands of the heirs of John Flint, lands of the heirs of Henry Lieber and the small lot sold to said Walradt, containing one hundred and twelve acres of land. Also this other piece of land lying in Dick's patent aforesaid bounded as follows: Beginning at the south east corner of John Flint's land and running thence north three degrees west to the bend in the line, thence north fifteen degrees east on the line of said John Flint's land etc. and containing 46½ acres. Descriptions mention adjaent lands o Jacob Flint and Robert A. Flint, and states that it is all the land owned by John Flint of Canajoharie, County of Montgomery, aforesaid and which he has any interest subject to a judgment in favor of Abraham Roseboom against said John Flint ad a mortgage given to Stephen Barnes for \$1000 with interest from the first day of April last, and excepting further eight acres in which said Flint had a life estate dependent on the life of his mother Mrs. Snyder, wife of Wm. Snyder and about a quarter of an acre is reserved for a burying ground though not hereafter to be used as such.

This is signed by John Flint and Eve Flint and witnessed by J. E. Cary, executed before J. E. Cary on February 20, 1840 and recorded in Montgomery County on February 26, 1840. A. J. Comrie, Clerk of Montgomery county, N. Y.
