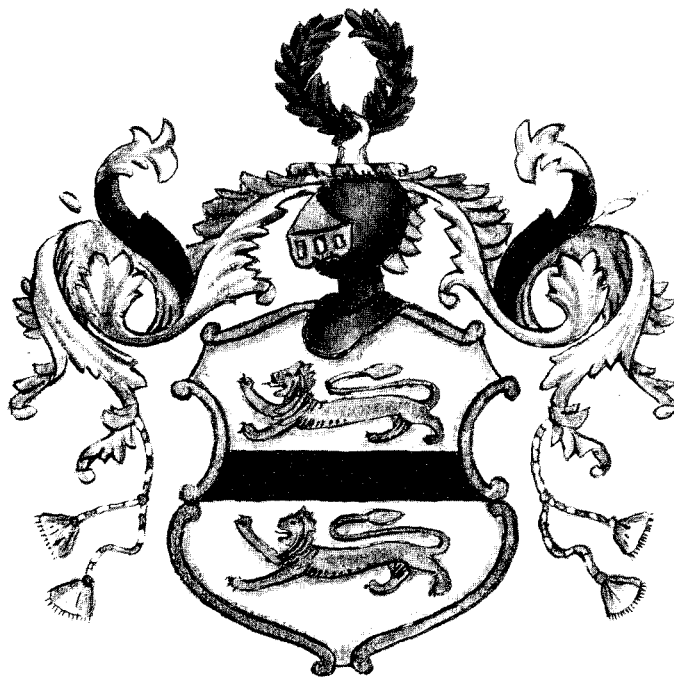

COAT OF ARMS-----KNABB

Arms; Gules, a fesse azure between two lions passant, or.

Crest: A hand grasping a laurel wreath, proper.

Interpretation of the description:

The shield (arms) is red (gules) and on this is a cross bank (fesse) of blue (azure) which is between two lions in walking (passant) and of gold (or).

The crest is a hand grasping a laurel wreath in natural (proper) tinctures.

Notes:

Then, in addition to the design based on this official heraldic description we have added a knight's helmet in the blazon and his cloak or mantle around the helmet and shield. This is a custom when blazoning in tinctures. The helmet and cloak have no official meaning in that they are registered or are a special part of the KNABB family history.

They do have some meaning though for the arrangement here shows how our heraldic ancestors liked to make a display of the arms when first the shield was hung on a wall peg, then the knight removed his helmet and hung that on the peg over the shield. On special-dress up days the crest was attached to the helmet by means of a wreath as shown here under the hand. This wreath was made of twisted strands of cloth or leather. Lastly, the knight took off his cloak and draped it over the helmet with ends falling to each side of the shield.

Such a display was a matter of great social prestige for the right to bear arms made one a, "Gentleman"-- his wife a, "Lady"-- in years when just to called, "Mister," was an honor uncommon to most persons.

One, today, may be proud about heraldic ancestry for those who bore arms did live as better examples of conduct to others. Few realize how these coats of arms were rudders of life. In this respect a coat of arms is a fine document of family history. If our young people can be proud of their ancestry they, too, will live better lives and thus the importance of a coat of arms in the home.

There is much truth in the axiom-- "We are the product of all in the family who have gone before us."

PREFACE

We, the Compilers, offer to you, our kin, this first published record of our families, designed to preserve the family records of our ancestors and descendants.

We have been engaged since 1940 in compiling these records and there are many more records yet to be found.

With few exceptions, none of the old pioneers in this family have ever had any accounts written of their lives. The material in this book, has literally had to be "dug out" and hunted up and gathered from various and scattered sources.

The great amount of time and research with the expense, that has been used in gathering these records, has been a thing of joy.

Our forefathers who came to the south more than 160 years ago, left kindred, loved ones and home-ties far behind to explore the wilds and face danger in finding new homes. They endured hardships, lived under the most primitive conditions, and learned the hard way the great lessons in life of hard-work, thrift, self-reliance, courage, independence and above all, faith in God. For the most part they were poor, but were hospitable, kind and neighborly and a more honorable generation we will never know. In our present-day ideas, they were crude and illiterate but they had more "common sense" than our present generation will ever know. To be a descendant of these hardy, God-fearing men and women is an honor, and to share in their ideals is a sincere privilege.

We are encouraged today to find more interest than ever before, on gathering history and genealogy of our families and we sincerely hope that in the years ahead much more can be gathered and many more families traced.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION: The data contained in this family history was gathered by the Compilers from many sources, often unrelated and miles apart, and for the past twenty-three years. Many trips have been made to Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia, Washington, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, and many counties in our own State, to gather information. Census records, old newspaper files, Church records, Court House records, old family Bibles, tombstone inscriptions, many books searched and visiting with older people.

Many tales and stories have been told to us in our search, which cannot be printed, but will always stand out in our minds.

Just a short time ago I visited with Mrs. Georgia Avery in McAlpin, who is a descendant of Herod Raulerson. It was on this trip that I learned where Herod and Nancy are buried, in graves unmarked, at Deep Creek Cemetery in Columbia County. I then went to the cemetery and was going to hunt for Mr. Jesse Durrance, who I was told could show me the graves, and found him at the cemetery. He said, "sure I can show you the graves, grandma showed them to me many a time and said, 'that's my mother and father', I know that's right cause grandma said so". There are boards at the heads and a plant, which Mr. Durrance said he knew had been there at least 50 years. He said he had visited the cemetery many times with grandma, who was Emily Raulerson Sistrunk, a daughter of Herod and Nancy. Emily, who married Elisha Green first, told the family so many times that Elisha went off to the war and she never heard of him again. That she and the children stood on the porch and watched as long as they could see him going across the field and that was the last time she saw him.

Our Raulerson family, has been and is indeed a puzzle. We have not been able to connect the Raulerson lines together. There is Jacob, b. 1778 S.C., William, b. 1788 Ga. and Nimrod, b. 1795 Ga., who we believe are brothers, but no proof has been found to tie them together. Then there are several Raulerson women, who are probably widow's of brothers to the above, who have families, that ties have not been made. There are several people working on the different Raulerson lines, from California to Florida, so perhaps some day we will solve the puzzle and get the "lost" ones in place.

William Bird was shown in the 1830 census of Bulloch County, Georgia with the above children. His will dated 16 May 1831, was probated 4 July 1831 in Emanuel County, Georgia and recorded in Will Book "A", page 21.

Faitha, maiden name unknow, drew 111 acres of land in Emanuel County, Georgia on 29 November 1853 in the Bounty Grant.

GEORGIA:
EMANUEL COUNTY:

This being the last will and testament of William Bird late of the said State and County who being about to depart this life and being in his common senses and as much so as any man that is in a low state of health and being desirous to dispose of his property to his own satisfaction after all lawful debts and law charges are paid the following is the said Wm. Bird's will, viz:

- 1st. To my oldest son Parker I give one cow and calf.
- 2nd. To my little son Wm. twenty cows and calves.
- 3rd. The balance of my stock cattle to be equally divided between my wife and the rest of my children which said stock is to be divided when all lawful debts and law charges is paid.
- 4th. My wife I wish to keep the little children, cattle, until they are free for the maintain them and to give them schooling out of the same.
- 5th. All the household furniture together with the plantation tools and cart is not to be interrupted by nobody but is to remain for the sole use and benefit of my wife and little children.
- 6th. The land I WISH TO be sold when the youngest boy comes to the age of twenty-one and equally divided between the two youngest boys.
- 7th. and the hogs to be for the raising of the little children.
- 8th. and two creators for my wife and little children but the sorrel mare is for my little son William.

This will made by the late deceased William Bird the 16th of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one.

Parker Bird and Hester Lanier were married on the 10 July 1828 in Bulloch County, Georgia. They are found in the 1830-40-50 census of Bulloch County and Parker is in the 1860 census without a wife and in 1880 he was living with his son, Augustus Bird. Parker Bird was granted 750 acres of land in Bulloch County on 30 Nov. 1853 in the Bounty Grant. He had sold 700 acres on 9 Nov. 1840 in Emanuel County.

Daniel and Stephen Gibson came to Glynn County, Georgia, and
 acquired lands there and both became wealthy, though Stephen

Do made and publish this my last will and Testament Hereby revoking and making void all former wills at any time heretofore made- and first and principally, I commit My Soul unto the hands of my Creator who gave it and the body to the earth to be interned at the descretion of my Executors herein after named- and as to Such worldly estate, wherewith it hath pleased God, to intrust Me. I dispose of the same as follows- Viz.

Item) I give and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy Gibson one negro Girl named Rachael and one fifth part of my stock of Cattle to her and her heirs forever---

Item) I give and bequeath to my Daughter Jane Gibson one negro named Linda and one fifth part of my stock of Cattle to her and her heirs forever--

Item) I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah and her heirs forever two negroes named Moll and Charity, one bed and furniture and one fifth part of my Stock of Cattle.

Item) I give and bequeath to my beloved Son John Gibson All my real estate lands and tenements, five negroes named Jack, Dick, Lettice, Lien and Sandy, one bed and furniture, plantation tools, Horse, Hogs & the remaining two fifth of my Stock of Cattle he paying out of said Legacy all my just debts to hold to him and his heirs forever, provided nevertheless and it is my express will And desire that the Said legatee John Gibson Shall pay over To the Children of my Daughter Margaret Hopps as soon as they arrive to the age of 21 Years the Sum of two hundred dollars And one half of the Cattle and their increase bequeathed To him the Said John as above to be equally divided between them and provided also that my Son John and my Daughter Sarah shall well and truly Maintain clothe and feed my Beloved wife, Delilah Gibson during her natural life or During the Term of her widowhood.

Item) I give and bequeath to my Daughter Susannah Burney the sum of 25 cents.

Item) I give and bequeath to my daughter Dice Gibson the sum of 25 cents and all the remainder of my estate Whether in ready money goods or Chattel, I bequeath to my Above named Son John Gibson and I do hereby appoint Him my Said Son John Gibson and my trusty friends John Fort and Elias Fort Executors to this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills codicils and bequests whatsoever by me heretofore made in writing hereof I have hereunto Set my hand and seal the second day of May in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred & fifteen And in the 39th

Nothing is known of the earlier life of William B. Knabb. First record found of him is the 1820 census Emanuel County, Georgia, as a single man. He was married ca 1829 to Temperance Williams, born 1810 North Carolina. The parents of William or Temperance have not been found. They are buried in the Simeon Warren Cemetery at their old home place in Emanuel County, graves unmarked. William is found in the 1840-50 census Emanuel County, Georgia. He is shown in the 1841 Tax Digest of Emanuel County with 400 Pine and 1 Poll.

Simeon Warren was the Administrator of the Estate but no record was found where the estate was disposed of.

William B. was a Surveyor and a carpenter. Recently I found another descendant of his in Alabama and she told of a story that had been told about William. "William B. Knabb was born in Maryland and came to Savannah, Georgia, staying a short time and had started to go back to Maryland, putting his tool box on the ship, and after standing on the dock, decided to stay and let the ship pull off with his tools and he stayed in Savannah." The story has always been told in our family that William B. Knabb was born on a ship coming to America. Records show that he was born in Maryland. My theory is that if he was born on a ship, then they landed in Maryland and that was his place of birth.

He was granted land in the Headright or Bounty Grant on the 17 December 1853 in Emanuel County--100 acres, Book Y-5, page 1033. Also, he was granted 115 acres in Emanuel County on the 13th December 1847, bounding on one line, by vacant, on one line by unknown, and on seven lines, by Richard Edenfield. (Original Grant Book W-5, page 70).

William B. Nabb deeded to his daughter, Margaret Waters, for his natural love and affection which he has and bears to the said daughter, part of the above 115 acres of land surveyed for the said Wm. B. Nabb, supposed to be thirty of said survey, lying in the fork of the two McCulloughs Creeks, adjoining John H. Edenfield, dated 16 May 1873, recorded 10 May 1916.

Temperance Nabb, Margaret Waters, Caroline Nabb, A. J. Nabb, Simeon Warren and Martha Warren sold to Arthur Powell on the 5 January 1875, for \$125.00, 175 acres of land in the 58th District G.M. of Emanuel County, being a part of two tracts of land surveyed for Wm. B. Nabb. All names were signed with "X" except Martha and Simeon Warren. Witnessed by Edward Warren and Caroline Waters.

Wm. B. Nabb, as Parent deeded for Andrew J. Nabb on the 21 April 1854 in Emanuel Co, for \$20.00, 62 acres to Elezar Warren, being a tract of land originally granted to Andrew J. Nabb.

Petition of G. W. Nabb showeth that William B. Nabb, resident of Said County (Emanuel Co.) departed this life on the day of 187 leaving your petitioner as the next of Kin and also leaving a small estate worth the sum of \$400.00 entirely intestate. Petitioner requested permanent letters of administration 28 Jan 1880; granted. The petition of G. W. Nabb respectfully showeth that Wm. B. Nabb, late of said County separated this life 1879 (this was also a petition for permanent administration) Jan. 2, 1880; granted. Granted to G.W. Nabb of the County of Emanuel, etc.

We find Knabb/ Nabb/ Nab in records in Maryland and Pennsylvania, and all the given names run much the same as had been handed down thru the later generations. We have been unable to find a will that would connect our William B. with these families, although I am sure he comes from some of these families and perhaps came to Georgia alone. Several years ago we visited the old plantation in Pennsylvania where three Knabb brothers settled when they came from Germany to America and the cemetery where they are buried. The homes are still being lived in by some of the descendants. The tombs on the first two generations are inscribed in German. The cemetery is on a knoll above the homes in a field and is filled with beautiful iris. I pulled up some plants and they bloomed this year for the first time and were beautiful, different from the iris that we have in Florida. A great granddaughter of one of the Immigrants carried us around and showed us the different places. She had in her possession a small iron pot that was brought from Germany when they came to America that the folks cooked their grits or hominy in and she gave the pot to me, also a pewter fruit bowl that belonged to them that was brought over from Germany but made in England. These possessions I prize very much and am grateful that she thought enough of me to give them to me, a perfect stranger to her. At that time she was

75 years old and had just retired from working. She lives by herself and travels quite a lot. Last year she attended the World's Fair in the State of Washington. Her name is Clara Knabb "an old maid", and a very lovely person. She has a sister and brother who also live in Reading and we visited with them also and met other members of the family. In giving me the iron pot and pewter bowl she said, "there is no one in my family that cares about these things and I think you will take care of them".

William Knabb, a son of William^u and Temperance Williams Knabb was born in Georgia in 1832, probably in Emanuel County. He was granted 100 acres of land in the Headright or Bounty Grant on 17 December 1853 in Emanuel Co., Book Y5, page 1033, bounding by Nelson Dickerson, Wm. B. Nabb, vacant, and by James Warren.

William enlisted, with two brothers, Andrew Jackson and George Washington, in the (C.S.A.) Civil War on 7 May 1862 in Savannah, Georgia for three years by Col. Harrison in the 57th Reg't. (Harrison's) Georgia Infantry, as a Private and died in Georgia Hospital in Savannah, Georgia on 11 August 1862. His wife went to Savannah and brought him back and buried him in the corner of their field in Bulloch County.

His signature appears on a Bounty Pay and Receipt Roll.

After William died Martha married _____ Jones and had one daughter, Mary, but the younger children, Madison David and Elbert took the name of Jones and always went by that name.

Martha died in Echols County, Georgia and is buried there.

"Jeff" was born 5 November 1880 in Baker County, a son of James W. and Mariah E. Brown Knabb. He was married 21 May 1902 in Baker County to Leona Howard. There was no issue by this marriage but they reared a nephew, Lucious Lamar Knabb.

"Jeff", as he was known was one of the most prominent and influential men that Baker County has ever produced. He started out in life farming and cutting cross ties, peddling his farm products in neighboring towns. At the time he married he was working with Courson and Company, Naval Stores Operators at Baxter, but soon moved to a farm near his father's place on the North Prong of the St. Mary's River and farmed for several years. About 1906 he bought a Naval Stores business at Baxter and stayed there three years and then in 1909 sold out and moved to Manning. About 1915 he bought a place at Pinetop and moved there, continuing his Manning operations. He continued to increase his operations, being in business with his brothers, Lucious and William at

at various times.

He served in the Senate, representing the 29th District of Baker and Clay Counties, during the sessions of 1929-1931.

At the time of his death he was owner of more than 10,000 head of cattle and over 50,000 acres of pine timber land.

Lucious was born 6 May 1882 in Baker County, Florida, a son of James W. and Mariah E. Brown Knabb.

He was married to Minnie Dowling, a daughter of Riley and Emmie Crews Dowling, 31 October 1901. He departed this life on January 1955, being a little less than 73 years old. His wife preceded him in death about eleven years. They are buried in North Prong Cemetery, Baker County, Florida.

Lucious tried farming for his first livelihood, but he soon turned his attention to other things, such as mercantile business. Later he engaged in timber and Naval Stores and before his life work was over, had invested in many other adventures, such as banking, contracting, road building, insurance and many others. He organized the Guaranty Life Insurance Company. He made a success with anything he

invested in. He organized the Citizens Bank of Macclenny and was its President, until his retirement a few years before his death.

Lucious rose early in the morning and was up late at night. He worked hard all the time and could see great possibilities in the future. He could probably see as far into the future as is possible for mortal man to see. He was a good man always helping those that went to him for help. He had an unquestionable reputation of trusting every one and seeing good in them. He loved his family, but he was away from home a lot of the time and has been known to drive hundreds of miles just to spend the night at home with his family.

Lucious always saw the need in his helping out with public affairs. He helped in his county as Commissioner of Roads and Revenue. Served in the Georgia House of Representatives in the sessions of 1919 and 1920. He served his State as a member of the State Senate from Charlton County, Georgia in the session of 1937.

Lucious and his wife were baptized in the Primitive Baptist Church, Pleasant Grove, in Baker County and were both faithful and devout members. They loved their church and took off what time was needed to do any church duty or assignment that they might have.

William Knabb, born 24 September 1890 Baker County, Florida, a son of James W. and Mariah E. Brown Knabb. He was married 30 July 1914 to the former Ida Mae Wiggins of Alachua County, daughter of Oscar Albert and Amanda Caroline Terrell Wiggins, in the Eden Baptist Church, near Hawthorne, by the Rev. E.M. Henderson.

To this union were born six children and they now have ten grandchildren and twelve great-grandchildren.

Will's first employment away from home was at the age of 18, when he accepted employment as a sawmill laborer, working a ten hour night shift for \$1.00 per night or 10¢ per hour. In 1908 he switched to naval stores and ran a dip squad for his brother at \$20.00 per month and room and board. He recalls that the first money he ever earned was \$1.00 for planting 10 acres of cotton.

In 1914 he was operating a turpentine camp in Clay County when the depression forced him out of business. He then came back to Baker County and went into farming and cross-tie business for about a year. Then came a try at mercantile business in Bradford County. Again in the farming, trying cotton and tobacco and the boll weevil ate up the cotton and heavy rains ruined the tobacco.

Then came the decision which eventually placed him on a successful road. He bought a one-third interest in the naval stores business at Sapp and remained there for five years. He then moved to Raiford in Union County, having bought a turpentine business there. In 1927 he sold an interest to his brother, Paul, and moved to Macclenny and bought a half-interest in a naval stores business of another brother, Jeff. Upon Jeff's death he bought still further interests of the business and by 1938 the Company was working 125 crops of turpentine faces. They also had constructed and were operating the largest turpentine still on record. This still was a tremendous labor saving operation since it combined into one the capacity which formerly required the operation of three smaller, but average for the time, sized turpentine stills.

At this time, he and his children are working approximately 50,000 acres of slash pine. Operations include cutting saw timber and pulpwood in selective cutting system and following up with a program of reforestation by planting an average of half-million slash pine seedlings per season.

He was one of the early members of the ATFA and was elected a director in 1948.

He is a member of the Macclenny Primitive Baptist Church and was a charter member and past-president of the Macclenny Lions Club. He served five years as trustee of Union County schools and four years as a Commissioner of the City of Macclenny.

He is Commodore of the Ancient and Illustrious Order of the Commissioners of the Torid Zone.

I am writing to you to express our deepest sympathy on the
 death of your son, Sergeant Hubert L. Raulerson, ASN34057490,
 who was killed in action on the 22nd day of September, 1944
 in western Germany.

Hubert was in action with his company against the enemy when
 he was killed instantly. He died immediately without
 suffering any pain. A chaplain of the United States Army
 officiated at his burial service which was held with full
 military honors in a military cemetery, located in Belgium.

Your son joined the "Raider" regiment in 1942 and was one of
 those men whom we consider an "oldtimer". He came overseas
 with us in the invasion of Africa, and fought gallantly in
 Morocco and Tunisia. In May 1943 he was wounded, but re-
 turned to the regiment in September of that year, coming

to England with us to prepare for the campaigns on the continent of Europe. He was a member of Company "L" and as a recognition of his efficient and courageous performance of duty was appointed as Sergeant and assistant squad leader on the 15th day of September 1944. His devotion to duty and sincere effort, despite physical hardship and danger, upholds the highest traditions of the United States Army.

We, the officers and men of his company and regiment, extend to you our heartfelt sympathy. Your son's loss is keenly felt by all who knew and served with him, and his memory as a soldier of this regiment remains as an inspiration to us who carry on the fight. We share your loss, and we remember both him and you in our prayers.

Jacob Raulerson, ancestor of a large family connection of Wayne and Brantley Counties, Georgia, was born in 1778 South Carolina. He went to Georgia in early life and married. His first wife, Mary Baggs, was born in Georgia in 1780 but so far her parents have not been learned.

Jacob moved to Appling County in 1819 and settled on Lot 415, 4th District of Appling County, now Wayne. This was on the little Satilla River. He later sold out and settled on the same river on Lot 67, 3rd District of Wayne, now Brantley County, near the present village of Hortense. He died there in 1857. In his will he directed that his body be buried in the "old family burying grounds at Samuel M. Pearson's."

The will of Jacob was dated 22 April 1857, and was probated 2 November 1857, and named his sons, Russell and James F. Raulerson, and son-in-law, Samuel M. Pearson, as Executors. It directed that his five slaves, all his other personal property, and a lot in Cherokee County and land and proceeds equally divided between Ichabod, James F., Russell, David and Wade H. Raulerson, Samuel M. Pearson, Hillery Cason and Abraham N. Knight. The other children were allowed nominal legacies of \$10. each. His wife, Mary, was provided for in the will. The estate inventory showed a total of \$3235.83 in notes and account and "perishables", and \$8223.74 in slaves, lands, etc. It appears that the deceased was operating a country store at the time of his death in addition to his plantation operations.

Jacob served in the militia during the War of 1812 serving as a lieutenant in the Wayne County militia in 1813, and as a mounted spy under Capt. Richard Walker at Fort Wayne on the Wayne County frontier in the winter of 1814-15.

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN: I, Jacob Raulerson of the County of Wayne and State of Georgia, being of sound and disposing mind and memory and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs while I have strength so to do, do make and publish this my Last Will and Testament hereby revoking all wills by me at any time heretofore made and first I do commit my soul to the God who gave it and my body I desire to be buried in the family burial ground at Samuel M. Pearson in Wayne County and me worldly estate I dispose of as follows:

FIRST, to my wife, Mary Raulerson, I give and bequeath Hester, a negro woman and her children to-wit: Levy, Charles, Henry and Edward and all of her increase.

SECOND, to my son Herod Raulerson, I bequeath ten dollars in money.

THIRD, To my son-in-law, George W. S. Waldron, I give and bequeath ten dollars in money.

FOURTH, To my daughter Elizabeth Keen, I do give and bequeath ten dollars in money.

FIFTH, To the lawful heirs of my daughter, Elender Smith, I do give and bequeath five dollars in money.

SIXTH, To my daughter Lenor Wilkinson, I do give and bequeath ten dollars in money.

SEVENTH, To my son-in-law Alexander G. Middleton, I do give and bequeath ten dollars in money.

EIGHTH, To my son-in-law Christopher Chancy, I do give and bequeath ten dollars in money.

NINTH, The following property I wish sold, to-wit: A negro man named Ned and a woman Peggy, Hosey a man, Sopy a woman, Bill, Andrew and Samme. Also all perishable property horses, mules, hogs, and tools and farming utensils and household furniture. Also the following land Lot No. 67 in Third District of Wayne Co., containing 490 acres also one lot of land in Cherokee number not recollected containing 40 acres and the proceeds thereof equally divided among the following named Heirs, Echabod Raulerson, Samuel M. Herod and Nancy are buried at Scott Cemetery, Columbia County, Florida. Herod Raulerson, born 27 December 1803, Georgia, son of Jacob and Mary Baggs Raulerson. He was married in Wayne Co., Georgia 16 February 1826 to Nancy Gibson, daughter of Eudicy Gibson. To this union were born nine children.

They moved to Columbia County, Florida after their youngest child was born in 1847. Both died between 1860-70 in Columbia County and are buried at Scott Cemetery, graves unmarked, north of Lake City, near where they lived. Herod owned 360 acres of land in Columbia County and the heirs divided it on the 2nd of December 1881. This was located on E/S of Old Cone Highway (#441), about 15 miles north of Lake City near Needmore, part of which now lies in the Osceola National Forest.

Herod served in the House of Representatives or General Assembly in 1852 from Columbia County. He is shown in the roll call of 23 November 1852. He was appointed on three committees, which were of great interest and importance at that time and required men who were mentally able to cope with the assigned responsibility. I think these men possessed great qualities of leadership and made quite a contribution to the subsequent effort in Florida's development.

1. He was appointed to a committee of three to formulate the rules governing the conduct of the House of Representatives.
2. He was appointed Chairman of the Committee on Propositions and Grievances.
3. Was appointed member of the Committee on Schools and Colleges.

Herod appears in the 1840 census of Wayne County Georgia, 1850-60 census, Columbia County, Florida. He is shown in the 1850 census with the nine children, ranging in ages from 2 to 23.

John G. Raulerson was mustered in the C.S.A. in 1861 and was killed in the battle at Chancellorsville, Virginia 3 May 1863. Guardian papers were filed 30 November 1865 in Columbia County, Florida and were witnessed by L.F. Raulerson.

It has been told that John was a very observing person and that no one could ever fool him. He came home on leave a short time after his daughter, Ida, was born and the neighbors decided they would certainly fool him now. One of the neighbors had a small baby born about the same time as Ida and they placed the babies together and told him to pick his baby-- and he did.

I, Hustus Studstill of the State of Georgia and County of Bulloch, being very weak and low in State of health but in perfect mind and memory but calling to mind the mortality of all men knowing it is appointed for all men once to die Do make and Ordain this my Last Will and testament, that is to say, Principally and first of all I give and Recommend My Sole Into the hands of almighty God that gave it, my Body I Recommend to the Earth to be buried In a decent and Christian Like manner at the direction of my Executors nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the Mighty power of God, and touching such Worldly Estate which it hath been pleased God to bless me with in this life I give, demise and dispose of in the following manner and from That is to say:

Item- I give and bequeath to my wife, Elizabeth one Roan mare which is about Eight years old.

Item- Then my will is that all my children Heirs of my estate should have each an equal share of My Estate and to be given proportionable as they Come of Age and my Will is that my Executors should hire out three negroes, namely Hannable, Philip and Hanner and applied to the use of my heirs at the discretion of the Executors.

Item- My will is that thirty-one head of cattle, \$100. which is now in the house and a negro woman by the name of Nancy would be let out and that my wife have the privilege of living that with the small children During her life or widowhood then the Land to be Equally Divided among my Children and I do constitute and appoint Drury Jones, Joseph Tanner, Josiah Sirmon and my son, William Studstill, my Executors of this my Last Will and testament disanuling all my former Wills heretofore made in witness whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and seal this 3rd of September 1804.

Hustus Studstill III owned a large plantation in Brooks County, Georgia and farmed with slave labor. He owned 1700 acres in one body, with 2 or 3 farms and a large mill pond and water mill on the lands. In his will he bequeathed \$1,000.00 in cash to his wife in lieu of dower, and gave the lands and his personal property to his two children by the second wife, with a proviso that if they died without issue the same would descend to his widow and the children by the first wife. His will was dated 17 October 1883 and was probated May 1884. He was Justice of Lowndes Inferior Court, 1853-1864 and was cut into Brooks County in 1858.
