ANCESTRY

John Talcott b. Braintree, England; emigrant to Cambridge, Mass. 1632; removed to Hartford, Conn. 1636; Representative to the General Court and Treasurer of the Colony; was called "The Worshipful" married Dorothy Mott.

Their son 2. Lieut. Col. John Talcott was Deputy and assistant Magistrate of Conn.; Treasurer of the Colony to succeed his father; one of the patentees named in the Charter of Charles II granted to Conn. 20 April 1662; Commander-in-Chief of Conn. troops in King Philip's War, 1676; hid the Charter of Conn. in the oak tree; married Helena Wakeman, dau. of Hon. John Wakeman and Elizabeth (Hopkins), emigrants to New Haven, Conn.

John Wakeman was a signer of the articles of agreement for both state and church of Conn. Colony; Deputy to General Court of New Haven Plantation, Oct. 27, 1641, and, in 1656 Treasurer of the Colony; b. Bewdley, Worcestershire, Eng. 29 Mar. 1601, d. Hartford, Conn. 1661.

Capt. Thomas Stoughton, emigrant to Dorchester, Mass. 1630; later removed to Hartford and Windsor, Conn.; an original proprietor of Hartford, Conn.; married --- Montpeson; d. Windsor, Conn. 1661; ancestor of Abiah Stoughton who m. Capt. Solomon Allyn at Windsor, Conn. 8 Dec. 1756.

### WILLIAM OF NORTHAMPTON, MASSACHUSETTS

1. William Miller, a tanner and planter; of Ipswich, Mass. 1638; indian fighter 1643; with 23 other men an original settler of Northampton, Mass. 1654; owned and settled a plantation in Northfield, Mass. 1672; lived on King St., Northampton, Mass. where he d. 15 July 1690; Patience his wife d. 16 Mar. 1716, very aged; Northfield, Mass. records say that she was a skilled physician and surgeon. Other records state: "The wife of William Miller is supposed to have been Patience Bacon, dau. William and Martha (Worcester) Bacon of London, Eng., b. about 1623 in St. Nicholas Parish; her uncle, Rev. William Worcester, was the first minister of Salisbury, Mass. William Miller was son of William and Margaret (Dennis) Miller b. in London 21 Nov. 1620."

Johanna Ford who with her father, Thomas Ford, came  
over with him in the "Mary and Ann." His son,  
Preserved Clapp, b. 1643, removed when about twenty  
to Northampton, Mass. and m. 1668 Sarah, dau. of  
Benjamin Newberry. Their dau., Hanna Clapp,  
m. 1 Jan. 1698 Abraham Miller youngest son of  
1. William.  
Preserved Clapp served as Representative to the  
General Court. He was ruling elder in the church,  
and Captain of Militia.

Residence Northampton, Mass. till 1745 when he removed with his family to Northington Parish, Farmington (Now Avon) Conn. and settled  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile north of Ciderbrook (a tract called Lee's Nod) west of the Talcott Mountain and east of Farmington River. He and his sons helped to build the first meeting house in Northington Parish in 1754. It was near the river and not far from their home. In October 1755 he was appointed and confirmed captain of the company or train band of the parish.

About 1789 he built the homestead about one-half mile north of Nod Corners on Simsbury Road, east side of Farmington River and under Talcott Mountain west, nearly opposite Wadsworth Tower. In 1818 when the Congregational Church in Avon (East) was built, he drew the timbers and gave besides \$500.00 in money. The homestead now (1906) is owned and occupied by his grandson Julius Keyes Miller, son of Edward. b. Farmington, Conn. 13 June 1765, d. Avon, Conn. 3 April 1842, m. The War Department, also, states that in July 1778; "John Smith served in the Revolutionary War as Captain of the 7th Company in a detachment of Connecticut Militia." He was then "on command at Sawpits." (Rye, N.Y.). In the Public Papers of George Clinton Vol. 3, p. 619, a letter from Col. Peter VanNess to the governor suggests that Capt. John Smith enlarge his company of rangers. The War Department Adjutant General's Office, Washington, states: "The records of this office show that one John Smith served in the War of 1812 as Captain of a Company in the 1st New York Militia commanded by Lieut. Col. John Harris stationed in the Town of Cambria on the Niagara Frontier." This company went out from Groton, Tompkins Co., N.Y.

On page 330 of the History of New London, Conn. by Frances Manwaring Caulkins, we find:

"John Wheeler appeared in New London 1667. He entered largely into mercantile concerns, traded with the West Indies, and had a vessel built under his own superintendence which, at the period of his death had just returned from an English voyage."

1. John Wheeler d. in New London 16 Dec. 1691. The probate records show that his wife, Elizabeth, survived him and m. 2nd Richard Steere of Southold, L.I. Elizabeth is said to have been the dau. of Lieut. John Wheeler who d. in Newbury, Mass. 1670 (Boston Evening Transcript, 16 Oct. 1916). This article states that John Wheeler of New London was son of Thomas Wheeler of Salisbury, Eng. and that Elizabeth was his second wife and cousin. The will of Richard Steere, dated 29 Mar. 1721, at Southold, L.I. makes bequests to Joshua Wheeler of New London, Conn.; to Elizabeth wife of Nathaniel Beebee; to their dau. Mary Elizabeth wife of Jacob Appleby of New London; to Anna wife of John Tong and to their dau. Elizabeth. The probate papers at Hartford, Conn. of John Wheeler's estate give his children's ages:
