NOTE.

HAVING for some time past collected such particulars as came to my notice in regard to the MINOT family (at first without any thought of publication), and having gathered much valuable information in England during the past summer, I now offer some of the results of my investigations to the different branches of the family, trusting that they may prove of interest. This pamphlet does not profess to be a history, but, as will be seen, is merely a genealogical record, a portion of which, prepared by the late Lemuel Shattuck, Esq., appeared in Volume 1, Nos. 2 and 3 (April and July, 1847), of the New England Historical and Genealogical Register.

To the many kind friends who have aided me both with material and advice, I am most grateful. Among these Walter Kendall Watkins, Esq., is entitled to the first notice. But for his untiring energy, perseverance, and great knowledge of genealogy, it would have been impossible for me to have collected a large portion of the following facts. I am also indebted to the Lord Bishop of Ely (Lord Alwyne Compton); to the Rt. Hon. Lord Braybrooke, of Audley End; to George William Marshall, Esq., "Rouge Croix," College of Arms, London; to the Rev. Edward Seymour Leveson Randolph, B.A., Vicar of Great Chesterford, Essex; to Henry W. Hunt, Esq., and others.

I have adhered to the more usual form of spelling the name, Minot, in order to avoid confusion, although one or more branches of the family spell it Minott. In some of the old documents in England it is spelled Mynot; in fact, in one or two cases in England a member of the family spelled his name in all three ways in one document.

The frontispiece is a reproduction of an ancient book plate, which was in use early in the eighteenth century.

In making this compilation attested records have been adhered to, and mere traditions have been rigorously excluded.

GENEALOGY.

THE name of Minot is frequently found in the early records of England. In 1307 Ida, widow of John de Wyckenham, granted to John Minot, of Coventry, a Capital Manse in Coventry. The grant is dated Monday after Purification, 1 Edw. In 1316 we find Michael Mynot a citizen of Π London; in 1329 Laurence Minot (the poet) remitting purchase money for wood in Cressy Forest, France; in 1337 Adam Mynot and his followers besieging the Abbey of St. Edmunds, and in 1363 Thomas Minot Archbishop of Dublin (who died in London, 1385). Those of the name seem to have belonged to one family, who lived in a belt of country comprising the counties of Suffolk, Cambridge, Essex, Warwick, and Gloucester.

Thomas Minot, of Saffron Walden, Essex, the earliest of the name from whom the American family can prove direct descent, was a man

of education and wealth; he married the daughter of Thomas de Hasilden, Esq., of Little Chesterford. This de Hasilden (born 1322, died 1401) ⁽⁵⁾

was a member of Parliament and a soldier. We read in Additional Manuscript, British Museum (15,662, fol. 201), that in 1375 he was licensed to have divine offices celebrated in the oratories or chapels of his mansions at Stepilmorden and at Gyldenmorden, showing him to have been a man of large possessions. By his wife Joan, a daughter of Sir Thomas de Burgh (of the Earl of Kent's family), he had two children: a son Richard, also a member of Parliament, and a daughter, who married the aforesaid Thomas Minot. In the Vincent Manuscript in the College of Arms, London, can be seen the arms of "Thomas Mynot Esq^r. of Saffron Walden Secretary to the Abbott of Walden." These arms as shown in the frontispiece of this book have been used by his descendants down to the present time. The position that he held as secretary to the abbot was probably only an honorary one, as the only mention that we find of it is in the aforesaid manuscript. Thomas Minot, by his wife (daughter of Thomas de Hasilden), had two sons, Richard, sometime steward to the abbot of Walden, who married Joane, the widow of — Thorne, by whom he had an only child, Agnes, who married Richard Dale, of Walden; and John, whose wife's name cannot be ascer-

tained.

In a "Survey of the Manors of the Abbey of Walden" (1399), in the possession of the Right (6)

Honorable Lord Braybrooke, at Audley End, there is an account of the lands held by Thomas Mynot and his sons John and Richard. The lands were situated in Springwell about two and one-half miles from Saffron Walden on the Cambridge road, near where the Parishes of Saffron Walden and Little Chesterford now meet. John, son of Thomas, left his property to his son William, who by his wife (name unknown) had one son, John. This John, of Springwell in the Parish of little Chesterford, by his will probated in the Archdeaconry of Colchester, 18 Dec., 1542, divided his property between his three sons, George, Robert, and William. Robert, the second son of the above John Minot, in his will probated in the Consistory Court of London, 7 Jan., 1559/60, after requesting to be buried "in the Church yard of Little Chesterford," and leaving his house and lands to his wife Ellen for the space of four years, bequeathed the remainder of his property to his five children, viz.: John the elder, John the younger, Anne, Katherine, and Margaret, leaving the larger portion to his sons. He appoints his brother William Mynot and William Freeman executors, with power to sell the house and lands in performance of his will. In the Parish Register (14 Dec., 1559) of Little Chesterford is recorded the burial of Robert Minot, and in the same register (7 Feb., 1595) is recorded the burial of his (7)

wife Ellen. John Minot the younger married, first, Mary Basse (she was buried 25 Jan., 1591/2), and, secondly (27 Nov., 1592), Christian Reynolds, and left issue. John Minot the elder, by his wife Anne, had five children, viz.:

Margaret, baptized at the Parish Church, Saffron Walden, 5 Sept., 1585.


Mary, baptized at the Parish Church, Saffron Walden, 5 May, 1588.

George Minot, the second son of the above John, baptized in the Parish Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, Saffron Walden, Essex, England, emigrated to New England to join the Dorchester Company, which sailed from Plymouth, 20 March, 1630, reaching Dorchester, 30 May, 1630, old style. (The name of the vessel he came in is not known with certainty, but is believed to have been the "Mary and John.") He became a freeman of the Colony, 1 April, 1634. His position in Dorchester was one of prominence, as on the 28th Oct., 1634, he was one of ten men chosen to order the affairs of the Dorchester plantation, and in the spring of 1636 he was one of the (8)

deputies to the General Court to order the affairs of the Colony of Massachusetts Bay.

His connection with the church was also a prominent one, his name being third among the seven who signed the covenant on the 23d of Aug., 1636, and he died after many years' service a ruling elder, 24 Dec., 1671; his godly character being expressed on the gravestone by the following lines:

HERE LIE THE BODIES OF UNITE HUMPHREY AND SHINING MINOT, SUCH NAMES AS THESE, THEY NEVER DIE NOT.

His position as a landholder and man of means doubtless tended to fix his position in Church and State; and the evidence of his wealth is shown in the acquisition of land at an early date, when the majority of the settlers were not supplied with a great amount of money.

It is known also that he acted as attorney for Robert Barrington and his son Thomas, and tradition includes the Earl of Warwick among his patrons. On the shore of the Neponset river, near the old Minot farm, lies imbedded the frame of the barque "Warwick," a vessel used in early

New England ventures.

The estate of George Minot amounted to £277.7.7.

By his wife Martha, born in 1597, who died 23 Dec., 1657, he had the following children, the first four being born in England and baptized at the Parish Church, Saffron Walden:

George, baptized 11 July, 1624, buried 20 May, 1626.

The Dorchester Church Record on its fly-leaf gives the birthdays of the last three.

John Minot was not made a freeman until 1665; this delay being due to his persistence in refraining from membership in the church, which was a qualification for a freeman. (10)

Under date 27, 7 mo., 1657, "same daye Martha minott p'sented by her father though he was noe memb accordinge to our church order: but a Corruptiō Creepinge in as an harbenger to old england practice viz. to make all members: (w^{ch} god p'vent in mercye)."

In 1660 a controversy arose regarding the baptism of John Minot's children; and two pages of the church record book are devoted to arguments on the matter.

3 Aug., 1664, the General Court passed an order repealing the said qualification as to being a church member, and 3 May, 1665, John Minot became a freeman.

He died 12 Aug., 1669, at the early age of 43 years. His estate was appraised at £978.5; and in his will provision was made for his father, who survived him, and the widow and children — John the eldest having £100 above the equal dividend to each of the children, Stephen to be placed at a trade, James to be kept at learning, and Samuel to be brought up as a husbandman.

HERE IS INTERRED THE REMAINS OF JAMES MINOTT, ESQ., A.M. AN EXCELLING GRAMMARIAN, ENRICHED WITH THE GIFT OF PRAYER AND PREACHING, A COMMANDING OFFICER, A PHYSICIAN OF GREAT VALUE, A GREAT LOVER OF PEACE AS WELL AS OF JUSTICE, AND WHICH WAS HIS GREATEST GLORY, A GENT'N OF DISTINGUISHED VIRTUE AND GOODNESS, HAPPY IN A VIRTUOUS POSTERITY, AND LIVING RELIGIOUSLY, DIED COMFORTABLY, SEPT. 20, 1735, ÆT. 83.


