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A Partial Genealogy of John Reynolds Born in England in 1612



EXPLANATION

In following the descendants of John Reynolds we have omitted the sir name, using only the given name.

Figure on left is the No. of child in the family, and Roman Figure the No. of generation from John, he being the first in America. Letters b. for born; d. for died; m. for married, etc.

In tracing from present to past generations take the name, the No. of name, No. of generation and the family to which it belongs, and you have a good directory from one generation to another.

We have traced the descendants of John Reynolds by his son, Jonathan, and his wife, Rebecca Husted, in Part One. In Part Two the tracing is of his son, John, and his wife, Judah Palmer. We find that the two lines come together in the marriage of Enoch and Mariah Reynolds in 1819, in the sixth and seventh generations and after a lapse of more than two centuries.

Their lineage hereinafter noted.

We are indebted to the Seventeenth Annual Report of the Reynolds Family Association for partial records of lineage of John Reynolds to the fourth and fifth generation, and to Spencer P. Mead's History of Greenwich for many military records. The Reynolds land transfers were taken from his History and we think Spencer P. Mead, LL. B., of New York Bar has more record of Greenwich than any other man. If you want a more interesting account of Greenwich read his book.

We have left blank pages for you to record the Reynolds families we have not found, and correct all errors, hoping some one will publish a perfect Genealogy of the Reynolds family.

AUTOBIOGRAPHY

Alvah Reynolds, son of Enoch Reynolds and Mariah Reynolds, compiler and publisher of this Genealogy Book, was born on a farm near Bedford Station, Westchester County, N. Y., May 22, 1830.

My father, with others, neighbors, hired a school teacher winters to teach their children. They came for miles around to learn how to read, write, and cipher. Our school building was small, with long benches for seats and a wide board fastened to the wall to write on. Our pens were made from a goose quill, and ink made by boiling the sap and bark of trees.

As soon as I was old enough I was sent out to learn the carpenter's trade. I worked some three and a half years for 30, 35 and 40 dollars a year. Two winters my boss did not have work, so I went home and went to school. My teacher then was a fine man and a good scholar. After I learned my trade I found work in and around New York City at 10 shilling and 12 a day the first year, and 14 shilling and 15 shilling a day for two years, and 16 shilling and 17 shilling a day for about one and a half years. I put about one-half of my wages in the Greenwich, N. Y., savings bank, lived and clothed myself on about one-half of my wages.

In the summer and fall of 1854 I got the Western fever and took Horace Greeley's advice to "go west, young man, and grow up with the country." In December, 1854, in company with my cousin, James H. Newman, started for Kansas to help build up that Territory into a free State. Lucky or unlucky, we never got to Kansas. We found difficulties we had not counted on. The suspension bridge at Niagara had not been opened for railroad traffic. We crossed over with our baggage on a temporary wagon bridge. Our emigrant train was a slow poke, 8 or 10 miles an hour, and stopped

for wood and water every two hours. Arriving at Windsor, we unloaded, ferried to Detroit, and loaded again for Chicago.

On arriving at Chicago we were pretty tired. Riding and sleeping on wooden benches for some three weeks had begun to wear on us, so we rested in Chicago some three or four days and started for St. Louis via Springfield and Alton by cars and river boat to St. Louis. To our dismay we found no river boats running on the Missouri River, so after a day or two we concluded to buy a yoke of oxen and rig a wagon with cover for our first home. We took a ferry boat across into Illinois to find the oxen. We met with fairly good luck, got the oxen and wagon and provisioned it in four or five days, and struck out. One incident: While eating dinner at the hotel some miscreant, black or white, confiscated Newman's overcoat, not stopping to take out the Bible he carried in it, given to him by a good lady friend in New York. I well remember the verse she wrote in each Bible she gave us. It read:

Pray hear to me, and not delay,
To read a chapter every day;
Pray read this book with pious care,
And for your dying hour prepare.

We drove along some four or five miles, came to wood and roads without fence and log house, with colored occupants, and some lank, wild hogs hunting for mask (food). Occasionally a nest of pigs where four or five mothers had left their little ones in a bed of leaves and gone off to hunt food. We were warned to leave the pigs alone, for an alarm from the pigs would bring the mothers and we would have to climb a tree. We finally came to the little town of Washington, on the bank of the Missouri River about Christmas. Was offered work in a saw mill which we accepted and worked there about two months. Not liking our occupation or location, we concluded to retrace our steps to St. Louis.

There we took a river boat for Peoria, stopped there several days. Not finding work at our trade we went to Rock Island, Davenport and Moline. Disappointed in not finding work, we walked to Geneseo, where Newman was taken sick with measles and I found work building an office for O. J. Stow, the druggist. By the time Newman was able to work and the office completed, we found work in Altona, Ill., building a tavern or hotel for Stewart Koon in June, 1855.

After the hotel was completed, we found work in and around Altona for three or four years. The prospects of political disturbances, Civil War, stopped all business in 1858, for four or five years, so that corn was burned for cooking and heating and sold for 10 cents a bushel in the markets.

In 1857 I bought a quarter section of land, N. W. S. two, 13 North, 2 East, 4 P. Meridian, for 2400 dollars, laying out. Had it to fence and brake, plow and build on for a home. In April, 1859, I got married to Susannah Hayden. We took up our abode in a shanty and went to work farming as best we could.

We done without all luxuries and many comforts for some eight or ten years. As times got better we added to our farm, so that in 1894 we had nine eighties; seven hundred and twenty acres of land in Ontario Township free of incumbrance. In that year we deeded to our six children each an eighty acres of land. In 1896 my wife died and my two youngest daughters kept house for me eleven years. In 1907, not wanting the care of the farm any longer, I sold it to my youngest son, Charles C. Reynolds. A part of the consideration was that I have a home with him as long as I live. The money consideration I divided equally between my children.

As to my religious views I am a firm believer in God, and in His Son Jesus Christ, as set forth in His Gospels to man.

Tradition says County Suffolk, Town of Ipswich. He married Sarah ———, born in England in 1614. They came to America from the Port of Ipswich on Ship Elizabeth early in 1633 to the New England colony in Massachusetts. They first settled at Watertown, where his first child, a daughter, was born in 1634 and named in honor of Ship that brought them safe over. They took out papers as free-men in 1635. Joined the church, as all citizens at that time had to be registered on the church records. Some Historians have thought and asserted that John Reynolds had brothers here, one Robert Reynolds, of Boston, lived at Watertown a short time and they associated together in church capacity. Robert Reynolds was authorized by the Boston Church to organize and establish a church at Weathersfield, Conn. John Reynolds and family, with others from Watertown, Mass., moved in 1635 to Weathersfield, Conn., and joined and helped build up the church (colony). Robert Reynolds moved back to Boston early in 1636. John Reynolds lived at Weathersfield, Conn., some five years, where his two sons were born. He moved to Stamford, Conn., in 1641, where his wife died August 21, 1657. He died in Stamford in 1660. Their children:

Mead's *Ye Historie of ye Town of Greenwich*, pp. 612, makes mention of ship, Elizabeth, sailing from Lydd, County Kent, England, under Captain Stagg, April, 1635, for the Massachusetts Bay Colony.

On Oct. 6, 1656, Jonathan Reynolds, with eleven other Freeholders of Greenwich, Conn., declared their submission and loyalty to the New Haven Colony by article of agreement. In 1665 the Freeholders, which included Jonathan and John Reynolds, made rules and regulations by which to dispose of lands without fence and permit settlers to come amongst them, at Annual town meeting held 1669. He was selected, with four other Freeholders, to survey and lay out land of Horseneck into four-acre lots for settlement. In 1672, the Freeholders of Greenwich had grown to

twenty-seven. Jonathan Reynolds' health was poor and he was compelled to retire from public service. He died 1673, and his brother, John, was selected to take his place. Jonathan married Rebecca, daughter of Angell Husted in 1658. Children, viz:

“Ye Historie of Greenwich,” by S. P. Mead, LL. B., of the New York Bar, makes frequent mention of various Reynolds in the French and Indian War muster roll records, which goes to show that people of this name were found ever at the post of duty, and played an active part in the establishment of this greatest of all nations.

Great credit is due Miss Amelia Todd, of Cross River, N. Y., for having secured and preserved records of a very large number of Reynolds families and relatives.

We are also indebted to the “Reynolds Family Association” Seventeenth Annual Report for partial records of many early families.

WAR EXPERIENCES OF NATHANIEL REYNOLDS,

I, VI, B. 1754

“War with its accompanying devastation usually terminates in food shortage, which is usually felt both by combatants and civilians. And thus it was in the Revolutionary War.

As time wore on the question of replenishing the commissary became serious at times, and the way usually found convenient was to send out foraging parties.

Or occasionally perhaps some unscrupulous civilian, too indolent to seek employment, and too disloyal to enlist, found it easiest to make a living by purloining food stuffs, and driving off livestock by night which he would butcher and sell to the Redcoats. It so happened, while Nathaniel Reynolds was home, probably before his enlistment, he was sleeping by the open window, and was awakened by the noise of the bars being slipped and dropped, and heard some of the cows walking over the lower bar.

He reprimed his flintlock, pointed in the direction of the bars and fired, then hastily reloading he waited, listening, but heard nothing more of the marauder.

Next morning he found the bars down and the cows wandering about the place. He grew to hate the Britishers who were continually marching by and pulling their cannon along the roads, pillaging the country and ill-treating its people, so decided to enlist and help free his country of English domination. He was unfortunately taken prisoner by the enemy and held in their detention camp on Long Island for over two years, where his employment was the making of coats for the British soldiers (he being a tailor by trade).

His wife and sister knowing of his imprisonment, and solicitous of his welfare, decided to visit him, and undertook and accomplished the journey on foot.

They walked to Long Island Sound (likely in the vicinity of Horse Neck) obtained passage across, and passports into the prison camp, where they found all well with Nathaniel. After spending two days with him they started on the return journey, and after crossing the Sound proceeding several miles, they were arrested at a British camp as spies and searched by the Redcoats. They were, however, released as nothing was found on them, Hannah having taken the precaution to do her message up in her hair. On being released they proceeded several miles, when they saw horsemen coming behind them, and despairing lest their message be found in their possession, they climbed over the stone fence at the roadside, and concealed themselves, after having lifted a stone and placed their letter under it.

They thus would escape the penalty of espionage.

While they waited in hiding, four troopers rode by and one was heard to remark, "Those women were in a hurry or they would be in sight by this time."

Knowing by this remark that they were for some reason being followed, they avoided the road for some miles, going across country.

They finally arrived home, having safely completed their journey, and at a time when the presence of British soldiers gave their martial law the right of might to govern."

This is a part of the war experience of my grandfather, Nathaniel Reynolds, as I remember it being told by him and grandmother, as I would occasionally visit them at Cross River with father and mother when I was a boy up to the time of his death in 1843, at which date I was 13 years old.

"The People of the State of New York, by the grace of God free and independent, to Nathaniel Reynolds, Junior.

Gentleman—Greeting:

We Reposing especial Trust and confidence as well, in your Patriotism, Conduct and Loyalty, as in your Valour and Readiness to do us good and faithful Service, Have appointed and constituted and by these Presents Do appoint and constitute you the said Nathaniel Reynolds, Junior, Lieutenant No. 1 of Captain Joseph Benedict's Company in the Regiment of Militia in the County of Westchester Whereof Jesse Trusdal Esquire is Major.

You are therefore to take the said Company into your Charge and Care as Lieutenant thereof and duly to exercise the Officers and Soldiers of that Company in Arms who are hereby commanded to obey you as their Lieutenant.

And you are also to observe and follow such Orders and Directions as you shall from Time to Time receive from our General and Commander-in-Chief of the Militia of our said State or any other your Superior Officer according to the Rules and Discipline of War.

In pursuance of the Trust reposed in you, and for so doing, this shall be Your Commission for and during our good Pleasure, to be signified by our Council of Appointment.

In Testimony whereof We have caused our Seal for Military Commissions to be hereunto affixed.

Witness our Trusty and Well beloved George Clinton Esquire our Governor of our State of New York, General and Commander-in-Chief of all the Militia and Admiral of the Navy of the same, by and with the Advice and Consent of our said Council of Appointment, at our City of New York, the twenty-fourth Day of June, in the Year of our Lord, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-six, in the Tenth Year of our Independence.

Passed the Secretary's Office 19th October, 1786.

Firstly and principally, I give up my soul to God, hoping for acceptance thro the mediation of His Son Jesus Christ our Lord. My body I commit to the earth to be buried with decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executor and as touching such worldly goods as it has pleased God to endow me with I give and dispose of in manner and form as followeth, viz:

Impr. My will is that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid out of my moveables.

Item. My will is that my honored father, Joshua Reynolds should have Ten Pounds, York Currency, annually for his support, provided he should have need of it out of my estate towards my part for his maintenance in case of need.

Item. I give unto my son, Caleb Reynolds, his heirs, etc., one-third part of my lands and as much more as shall be prized at Fifty Pounds, York Currency, provided he shall pay such part of the legacies to his sisters as shall be hereafter mentioned and he to have his choice in the lands.

Item. I give unto my two sons, Joseph Reynolds and David Reynolds, the remainder part of my land to be equally divided between them to be to them and their heirs provided they shall pay such legacies to their sisters as hereafter mentioned.

Item. I give unto my four daughters, Ann Reynolds, Mercy Reynolds, Eunice Reynolds and Mary Reynolds, Thirty-five Pounds each York Currency, and to my aforesaid daughter, Ann, I give Five Pounds more of like Currency, the said sums to be paid out of my moveables so far as they will go and what is wanting to be paid by their three brothers equally, or if they refuse to have it out of my lands. And I do nominate, constitute and appoint Mr. Gideon Reynolds (probably the Gideon, p. 66. Alvah's book, or Gideon, Jr.) to be the Executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking any former wills made by me ratifying and confirming this and only this as my last Will and Testament.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this 19th day of August, A. D. 1765.

FRENCH AND INDIAN WARS

In 1755 there was much trouble with the French and Indians and the General Assembly of Connecticut in March, 1755, ordered the raising of one thousand men. There was a company of 78 men, volunteers from Greenwich. Thomas Hobby was chosen Captain. Eighth Company were mustered into service in September, 1755.

- 53 Sir Joshua Reynolds, born at Plympton-Earls-Devonshire, July 16, 1723. Son of Rev. Samuel Reynolds, Master of the Grammar School there, and Theophila, his wife. His grandfather was Rev. John Reynolds, Prebendary of Exeter Cathedral, who died in 1692, son of Joshua Reynolds. His mother, Theophila, was the daughter of Matthew Potter, by daughter of Rev. Thomas Baker, Vicar of Bishop Nympton, the distinguished mathematician. His father's salary was only £120 per annum and he had eleven children. His first essay in oil painting was a portrait of Rev. Thomas Smart done with common shipwright's paint on a bit of sail in 1735, when only twelve years old. In 1740 he was apprenticed to Thomas Hudson, the portrait painter, for four years with a premium or fee of £120. In 1749 Reynolds made a voyage with Commodore (afterward Admiral) Keppel and visited Spain, Morocco, Algiers, and Italy. In Rome he made copies from Titian, Rembrandt, Guido, Papahad, etc. He visited every famous collection of

paintings in Italy. His two chief heroes (if you might use such a term) were Michael Augeo and John of Bologna. He returned to London in 1752. His two busiest years were in 1758 when he painted 150 portraits, and 1759 when he painted 156 portraits. During the height of his fame he made about £6000 per annum, but spent it lavishly, especially on paintings. He was especially intimate with Garricks, Goldsmith and Dr. Samuel Johnson. (He painted five pictures of the Doctors.) John Wilkes, the great friend of America in the Revolution, was a very intimate friend. He and Benjamin West were also great friends. In 1760 he bought for £1650 the house, No. 47 Lercestor Square, and spent £1500 more on improvements. He opened his new house with a grand ball. One of the features of his new home was a grand chariot, richly carved and gilded and adorned with panels by Charles Calton, the Elder, representing the four seasons. In 1764 he founded the famous Literary Club, which included such men as Dr. Johnson, Goldsmith, John Wilkes, Edmund Burke, John Barre, Warren Hastings. When the Royal Academy was founded in December, 1768, Reynolds was unanimously chosen President. George III Knighted him 21 April, 1769. In 1789 he lost the sight of one eye and his career as a painter came to an end. He died 23d of February, 1792, and was buried in the crypt of St. Paul's Cathedral, 3d of March. He was justly called "the greatest painter England ever produced," and one of the greatest in the world.



EVEN JUSTICE CARRIES A SWORD

You will observe from the above beautiful picture by Sir Joshua Reynolds in Oxford University that even Justice carries a sword. She stands erect, a noble figure, half human, half divine. The scales are ever before her eyes and therein she weighs the matter ere deciding. The scales come first. In civilized countries and under ordinary circumstances Justice needs little but the scales. Reason, progress, humanity—all that civilization stands for—"all that refines and elevates civilized life"—combine to give her decisions sanction and authority. But the sword is there—forever in reserve. When reason, progress and humanity are wanting, the sword is there. Not lightly to be drawn—but still the sword is there. They err who see alone the noble figure, the classic brow, the even balanced scales. They err who think that Justice pleads but never strikes. Though loath to draw the sword, she draws it, once the need is plain. Sym-

bolic figure still alive with truth! Men dream the day when force shall vanish from the earth. But Justice keeps her sword. Utopian visions float off when the scales alone shall fix the law of men and nations. But Justice keeps her sword. Men look forward to a time when no one shall oppress the orphan and the widow. But Justice keeps her sword. The blinded people of Mexico profess to see advancing from the north the sinister figure of a conqueror, panoplied for war, intent to destroy their country's sovereignty and to seize their lands. They catch the glitter of the sunlight on a sword and cry with rage. They say that this means war. No wonder they mistake the figure. They have too long been unfamiliar with it. It is a figure which this nation has done—is still doing—its best to establish in their midst, to set up in government place and market place. It is the figure to which they must look if they would live. It is their hope and the world's hope. It is Justice, Justice carrying the scales, but carrying, too, the sword.—*Chicago Herald*.
